Helping Neal celebrate were: Nick Johnson, John Hodges, Greg Prescott, Bob Steykal and Neal's brother, Gary Halousek.

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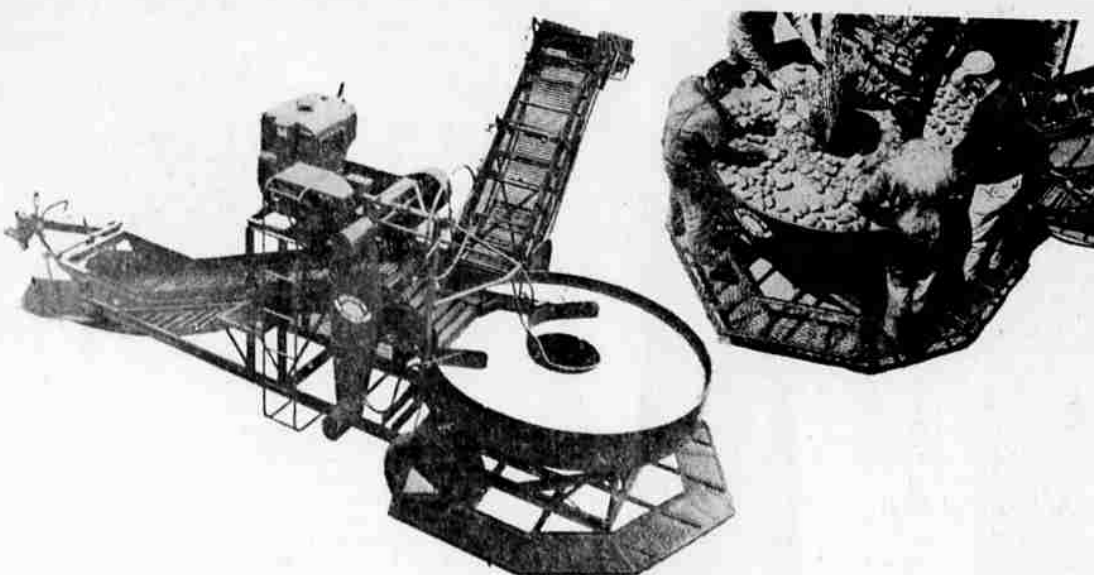
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
