Bob Hope To Portray Life Of Entertainer Eddie Foy

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—It was family day when Bob Hope began his picture on the life of the great entertainer Eddie Foy.

On one side of the stage were Bob's wife Dolores and the four little Hoopes. On the other was a group including at least three of the onetime little Foy—Mary, Madeleine and Charley. Another one, Bryan, was expected, but he

was busy starting a movie at another studio. He's a producer.

The two family groups and dozens of other amused spectators watched as Hope and seven talented youngsters ran through the first musical number of "Eddie Foy and the Seven Little Foy's." It was a riot. Hope and the kids were all decked out in yellow outfits, from shoes to bowler hats.

But the thing that interested me was that here was a different Hope. He has sprung eternal as the brash, slightly leering hepster. But now he was playing the elder Foy. His eyebrows were peaked, his eyes had a clownlike dot under them and his mouthline was extended with makeup to give him the purse-lipped Foy trademark. He also sang with a lisp and waggled his head like the old boy.

"I've worked with Bob for hours," said Charley Foy, who runs a night club in the San Fernando Valley. "He's amazingly like the old man."

"He says he's going after the role the way Jimmy Cagney did George M. Cohan. He did the dance numbers like Cohan, but the dramatic scenes were Cagney." Incidentally, Cagney will appear as

Cohan in the Foy Epic and do a number with Hope.
