**Mexican Held For Grand Jury**

Alfonso Torres, 28-year-old Mexican lumberjack, was ordered held for the county grand jury on a charge of assault with a dangerous weapon Thursday afternoon by District Judge D. E. Van Vactor.

Torres was alleged to have gone berserk in the bathroom of the Halfway House at Hwy on July 25, firing five shots and critically wounding Leon E. Jenkins, Weyerhaeuser Timber Co. employe.

Four witnesses appeared at the preliminary hearing for Torres. After hearing their testimony, Judge Van Vactor ruled there was sufficient evidence to hold Torres for the grand jury. His bond was set at \$2,800 and he was remanded to the county jail.
