MALIN

"Color and perfume is everywhere."

At Malin Flower Market, I do declare.

"The Flower Market" will be the theme of the Malin Garden Club's Flower show to be held at the Malin Grade School auditorium, Saturday, August 14 from 2 to 5 p.m.

All entries in horticultural classes must be grown by the exhibitor and should be labeled as to variety wherever possible. Containers for specimen classes will be supplied.

HORTICULTURE CLASSES
Gladioli - 1 stalk: 1. White (with or without colored throat); 2. Yellow; 3. Red; 4. Orchid; 5. Pink; 6. Any color not listed above.

Roses: 7. Hybrid Tea - 1 stem, any color; 8. Polyantha - 1 stalk, any color; 9. Any other type of rose - 1 stalk, any color.

Annuals: 10. Asters - single - three blooms; 11. Asters - double - three blooms; 12. Marigolds - double - one stem; 13. Petunias - single - one spray eight to 10 inches; 14. Petunias - double - one spray; 15. Zinnias - any type; 16. Larkspur; 17. Any annual not previously listed.

Perennials: 18. Chrysanthemums - any type - one spray; 19. Snapdragons - one spike; 20. Sweet William; 21. Pansies - three stems as long as possible; 22. Daisies; 23. Any perennial three blooms or one stem.

Dahlias: 24. Any type; Vegetables: 25. Carrots - six. Two classes - Baby - less than one inch, table - one to two inches. Carrots should be washed, fine hair root and tap root left on, tops cut off.

26. Cabbage - one head - bring outer leaves; 27. Beans - string - twelve; 28. Beets - six - washed, hair and tap roots on, tops cut off; 29. Squash - any kind - three; 30. Head lettuce - one - bring outer leaves; 31. Onions - six - two classes - green and dry; 32. Peppers - three; 33. Any type; 34. Berries - one basket.

All vegetables and fruit are judged for good culinary condition, not damaged by cleaning, useful, of reasonable size, no scars or blemishes, regularly, uniformly as to size, variety of type.

ARRANGEMENTS
Flowers used in arrangements need not be grown by the exhibitor but must be grown in the Klamath Area.

To market we go for loveliness in our living room. 1. A coffee table arrangement under eight inches; 2. Any general table arrangement.

Indoor dining on Market Day. 3. Simple low placed arrangement of various-colored summer flowers. Moods of nature suggesting; 4. Wind, 5. Snow.

A study using birds; 6. Bird print or suitable figurine with a flower arrangement.

Market Day Special. 7. Mass arrangement, any container, urn, tray or bowl, using fruits and/or vegetables and flowers to complete the composition.

Beauty on a budget. 8. Unique arrangements - bring what you have.

Tiny faces look up to me - from a miniature less than inches three.

The market is full of a number of things - bright baskets and hats make my feet take wings. 10. Basket or hat arrangements.

Milady a corsage here can find, for the flowers have come from every clime. 11. Gracious gestures in corsages.

GENERAL RULES
1. Entries will be received from 9 to 11 a.m. 2. No exhibits shall be removed before 5 p.m. 3. Only one entry in each class may be made by an exhibitor. 4. In judging, a first (blue), second (red), and third will be awarded in each class. 5. The Standard system of judging will be used, that is, exhibits are judged for perfection, not against each other. 6. The Garden Club does not assume responsibility for lost or broken articles. 7. The public is invited to exhibit on an amateur basis.

Competitive Specimens: For the purpose of this flower show, the following definitions have been adopted:

Stem: Shall bear only one completely open flower. Any bud on a stem regardless of the development must be counted and any that shows color is considered a flower.

Spray: Portions of plants with a number of flowers on one stem. Entries must contain the exact number of stems, etc., specified.

Spike: A flower structure with flowers stemless on a common lengthened stalk. Entries must contain the exact number of stems, etc., specified.

WASHINGTON (AP) - How Oregon members of Congress were recorded as voting on recent roll calls:

Senate
On adoption, 49-40, of Malone (R-Nev.) amendment to foreign aid bill to forbid use of foreign aid funds for stimulation of strategic minerals production abroad: Cordon (R) and Morse (Ind.), for the amendment.

On adoption, 75-12, of Knowland (R-Calif.) motion to refer resolution calling for censure of Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) to a bipartisan committee to be appointed by the Vice President: Cordon and Morse, for the motion.

On adoption, 45-41, of Long (D-La.) amendment to foreign aid bill to limit new appropriation for that purpose to \$2,550,000,000, a cut of \$500,000,000: Cordon and Morse, against the amendment.

On passage, 67-19, of foreign aid bill as amended: Cordon and Morse, for.

On rejection, 44-29, of Ferguson (R-Mich.) amendment to put \$350,000 into supplemental appropriation bill for moving Civil Defense Administration from Washington to Battle Creek, Mich.: Cordon, for the amendment; Morse, against.

House
On passage, 293-55, of bill to provide immunity for witnesses before Congressional committees and grand juries, purpose being to compel defiant witnesses to testify: Norblad (R), Cordon (R) and Ellsworth (R), for; Angell (R), not voting.

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Seven Die In Oregon Accidents

Weekend accidents claimed the lives of seven in Oregon. Five died in traffic mishaps and two were drowned.

Edwin Tole Johnson, 38, a Portland Scoutmaster, drowned in a swimming accident at Camp Mil-

lard five miles north of Estacada Saturday. Swimming with a group of Scouts, he had been swinging out over a pool on a rope and then dropping into the water. After one such drop he failed to come to the surface. Scouts pulled him out, but artificial respiration failed to revive him.

Jerry Bruneau, 10, lost his life in a municipal swimming pool at a Portland park Saturday. His body was found in six feet of water by another youngster.

Girl Lost On Mt. Hood Found Okay

PORTLAND (AP) - A 7-year-old girl, lost on the slopes of Mt. Hood Sunday, was found by searchers early Monday. The girl, Carol Wheeler of Portland, was in good condition.

She wandered away from a family picnic east of Government Camp. The search started before dark, but it was not until hours had gone by and the temperature had dropped to about 40 degrees, that the girl was found.

William Maruch, 59, Opportunity, Wash., was struck and killed by an automobile as he and his family were crossing a highway south of Portland Saturday. The driver said he did not see Maruch in time to stop.

Charles Curtis Hershman, 25, Chillicothe, was injured fatally Sunday when a car he was riding in

skidded into a tree on State Highway 62. Three others in the car were not hurt seriously.

Pedro Arriola, 21, El Paso, Tex., was killed outright Saturday night. He was struck by a car 15 miles south of Klamath Falls. Police said the driver, Thomas H. Wasson, Klamath Falls, told them Arriola jumped in front of the car while hitchhiking.

Patry K. Lantz, Sixes, died Saturday. His car ran off a highway near Gold Beach.

David Miller, 20, Oregon City, was killed early Saturday in the

plunge of his car from highway 213, three miles east of Oregon City.
