**Frank Sinatra Analyzes Reasons For Press Trouble**

**HOLLYWOOD** — What makes Frank Sinatra that way? Here is a guy whose career has been built on turmoil. With an Academy Award and all the offers he can handle, he is once again sitting on top of the show business world. Yet he seems restive and contentious to a sizable number of people.  
 "I have always enjoyed pleasant relations with him. I have found him friendly and helpful. Yet many columnists hate his guts. I tried to probe out the reasons for this when he talked in his dressing room for 'Young at Heart.' It was one of the rare times when he sat down and concentrated on one subject. But he still was restless. He rose to pace the floor as he talked or to have his secretary place a call."  
 "How are your relations with the Hollywood press?" I asked.  
 "All right," he replied. "They leave me alone. That's the way I like it."  
 I mentioned that he has had troubles with the press in the past.  
 "Sure, I've had some run-ins. But usually it's with columnists who feed on other people's personal problems. You'll find the ones who have given me trouble are the 6-cent variety. Maybe I overestimate them. They're the 4-cent kind."  
 "My so-called battle with the American press is just nonsense. If the whole press were mad at me, how could I have gotten such

a good reaction as I did with 'From Here to Eternity'? The papers treated me fine. Those writers that hated me had sense enough to keep quiet.  
 "My principal beef is personal questions. I have never felt that other people had the right to inquire into my private life. I have always felt that way.  
 "I have tried to get it understood around town that I will talk about anything in the world but my personal life. You'd think people would understand. But no. Even on my last picture, 'Suddenly,' I'd talk to writers, and they'd get around to the usual questions. Believe me, I won't forget those people.  
 "If my wife (Ava Gardner) and I are having problems, it's our business. I certainly don't intend to say anything about it. In matters like these, I think it's only right that the man keeps his mouth shut. Anything that must be said will have to come from her."

**Crater Lake Park Chief Transferred**

Fred T. Johnston, superintendent of Crater Lake National Park since last November, has received a transfer to the National Park Service regional office in San Francisco where he will be chief of operations.  
 Mr. and Mrs. Johnston plan to leave about September 1. Their only son, Jerry, 18, who is employed this summer as a fire guard at Lassen Volcanic Park, will be a freshman at Chico State College this fall.  
 Johnston has been in national park service for 26 years.  
 New superintendent at Crater Lake National Park will be Thomas Williams, who is being transferred from his post as assistant superintendent at Mt. Olympic National Park, Port Angeles, Washington. They are expected to arrive about the end of August.  
 Crater Lake National Park, which lies wholly within Klamath County, has a permanent personnel of about 80 persons.  
 Travel during July of this year was up approximately 25 per cent over last year, Johnston stated. A good many improvements have been made in park facilities this year with more planned for the coming year.  
 Plans are well along for new bridges across Annie Creek and Good-Bye Creek. Contracts are expected to be let in a month or six weeks. The new bridges will eliminate present detours.  
 A new automotive repair shop is expected to be completed early in September at park headquarters. This will provide servicing for all snowplows and government equipment.
