Teen-agers returning to school this fall will plan class schedules to include required and optional courses for a well-balanced program. Why not plan to schedule the back-to-school wardrobe with the same forethought?

Careful planning before buying will enable you to have a well-coordinated clothes collection. So often when you buy on impulse, you purchase an item that you really don't need or one which does not coordinate with the rest of your wardrobe.

Here's a helpful hint. Make an outline the same as you do when writing a thesis. List your coats, your dresses, separates, including skirts, sweaters, and blouses, as well as the important accessories of shoes, gloves, hats, belts and scarves.

Be sure to note colors because color coordination is the key to making your clothes combine.

Next, determine your needs according to your way of living. If you live in a community where the atmosphere of informality prevails both at school and at parties, you will concentrate on sports clothes. If you live in a city where dates mean dressier - than - school clothes, allow part of the budget for party clothes.

Now carefully go over your list. The most important item in your wardrobe is your coat. If you are buying a new one this fall, be sure you select one that will blend with all your other clothes. When your coat goes to school as well as on dates, keep in mind this double duty requirement. Don't select any style that is too tailored.

This year there are handsome tweeds, elegant for dress - up as well as sturdy for everyday school wear. For a school coat, the finger-

tip length is news. Choose yours in exciting bright red fleece, or pastel alpaca, or bold plaid tweed.

Sweater Combinations
Perhaps you will find that several of your sweaters can be worn with only one or two skirts because of color coordination. Why not plan this fall to buy a skirt that will blend with more sweaters.

Perhaps your wardrobe list will show that you have too many plaid skirts or too many plaids. This year you should plan to buy a tweed in the colorful mixtures that coordinate with many hues of sweaters. You will find magnificent tweeds in skirts and jackets, and the bulkier the fabric, the newer the look.

Be sure your sweater collection has one or two novelty styles, not just basic classics. Two-tone effects in Norwegian designs or contrast rib trims add dash to your solid color skirts.
