### USAF Lists Job Openings

Prior servicemen who are qualified in any of 25 job specialties may enlist in the Air Force in grades higher than those previously offered, the local Air Force Recruiting Office announced today.

Department of the Air Force regulations now permit Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard veterans to maintain their equivalent rank if they were among the top three enlisted grades at the time of discharge. Enlistment must be accomplished within 90 days of discharge date and authorized grades will go high as technical sergeant.

The more lenient policy applies to persons who qualify for enlistment in the Air Force specialties of intelligence, photo interpretation, cartographic supervisor, control systems, weapons electrical technician, radio and radar train-
