



Oregon Trout To Be Planted

More than three-quarters of a million trout remain to be stocked from game commission hatcheries throughout the state. Reino Koski, in charge of fish liberations for the game commission, notes that all liberation units are working full time liberating yearling fish and fry fingerlings in various areas of Oregon. The smaller fish are planted in the larger lakes that have not been reached earlier in the year. Stocking of yearling fish will continue into the early part of September to provide fishing as late in the season as possible. The total weight of all fish released thus far in 1954 is well ahead of last year's total, and according to Koski, "We anticipate a new high of 600,000 pounds of legal fish will be reached."

Peruvian General Sent Into Exile

LIMA, Peru (AP)—Gen. Zenon Noriega, accused of attempting an armed revolt after his ouster this week as premier, has been hustled into exile aboard a Peruvian warship. A government communique said yesterday he was arrested at the war ministry and put aboard the warship. The government announcement said conditions were normal throughout Peru following Noriega's unsuccessful attempt to unseat President Manuel Odría with the help of rebellious army units.

Cuban President Plans Campaign

HAVANA, Cuba (AP)—Fulgencio Batista, who vaulted back to power in a 1952 army revolt, says he will give up Cuba's presidency Saturday in order to run for the office in the November elections. He is prevented by the constitution from seeking election while president. An official announcement yesterday said Batista would name his successor at a cabinet meeting Saturday.

Reds Launch Anti-Curse Campaign

MOSCOW (AP)—The big Soviet press campaign to clean up Russia's morals has taken a new tack. Cut out the cussing, the men are told. Komsomol Pravda, the organ of the Soviet Communist Youth League, is spearheading the effort to shush profane and vulgar language. A drive against drunkenness and hooliganism already has been going on several months with good results, the papers claim. Now Komsomol Pravda has cast a disapproving glance toward the

Urals industrial center of Sverdlovsk. The youth paper spread over two columns a letter from a Sverdlovsk citizen complaining of vulgarities heard about town. "Clean these evil words out of our rich, expressive language," the paper admonished. The letter writer had this to report about some workers in a big plant: "One recently began to speak to a new-girl worker there but the language he used was so bad the girl fled. There is also even a Komsomol member who continually uses vulgar and abusive language, in seri-

ous as well as jesting conversation. "And still another worker, only 17, who feels he shows he's grown up when he uses evil language..." The letter added that nothing was being done about all this. It pointed out that "recently there was a case of a man using such language in a crowded tram and nobody stopped him. In another case, a man used vile words in a public place right in front of a policeman..." The Soviet government lent a hand in the campaign against ex-

cessive boozing by shutting down many of the drink-and-run vodka stands on the streets of Moscow and other cities. One of the latest shots in the morals war was a newspaper article blaming American jazz for youthful waywardness.
