

Trucks Wins Seventeenth For White Sox

Yankee Rookie After AL Honors

NEW YORK (AP)—Bob the bartender is the New York Yankees' candidate for Rookie of the Year honors in the American League. They call Bob Grim the barkeep because his family runs a tavern in Brooklyn and he mans the spittoon during the off season.

When Grim beat the Philadelphia A's Tuesday night, he became the first Yankee rookie to win 15 games since Hank Borowy in 1942. Spec Shea might have made it in '47 if he hadn't come up with a sore arm and Whitey Ford might have done better in '50 if he had been with the club all season. But these are "night have" years.

Grim's feat is an accomplished fact. With 42 more games to go, the 24-year-old righthander could hit the 20 mark.

Casey Stengel was talking about the youngster in his office at Yankee Stadium after he had beaten the A's.

"The kid came down for our school," he said. "He was just out of the Marines and never played higher than class A ball so he didn't figure."

"Everytime we pitched him, he got the hitters out. Jim (Turner) liked him and so did everybody else. When we go to Vero Beach to play Brooklyn, I pitch him and he shuts out the regular Brooklyn lineup for six innings. They finally get some runs on him in the seventh after Phil Rizzuto makes an error.

By the end of the spring training season, he looks like about the best pitcher we've got in camp, so I said to George Weiss, "I think this boy belongs in our organization."

We put him in right spots until he got used to things. Then we started pitching him against the big clubs. It's a good thing we've got him, the way some of our pitchers are going. Whitey Ford, Grim and Johnny Sain, that's about our pitching."

Grim, a pleasant youngster, never made Kansas City," he said. In his last year before the Marines, he was a 16-5 winner at Binghampton in Class A under Bill Skiff, veteran minor league manager.

At an age when most fast ball pitchers are relaxing with their press clippings, Virgil (Fire) Trucks of the Chicago White Sox is blazing his way to his best season in the majors.

The 35-year-old speed merchant needs only three more victories to equal his previous high of 20. In his present form this looks like a cinch.

Trucks, who broke into organized ball in 1938 and reached the big time in 1941, has been the sensation of the American League the past two seasons. After a miserable 5-19 record with Detroit in 1952, he posted a brilliant 20-10 mark last year, dividing his services between the old St. Louis Browns (5-4) and the White Sox (15-6).

His work won him top honors in the Associated Press poll for the "Comeback of the Year."

Except for 1953 Trucks has been a consistent winner. Even in his bad year two of his victories were no-hitters. Last season, when he reached 20 for the first time, he won his 17th game on Aug. 23. He pitched five shutouts over last year.

Now he's 12 days ahead of that pace. He whipped the Baltimore Orioles 1-0 yesterday for his 17th triumph and his fifth shutout against five setbacks.

Trucks gives full credit for his improvement to Manager Paul Richards of the Sox.

"It's a real pleasure to work for him," Trucks said. "I feel I'm really doing my best and I'd like nothing better than to win 20 again."

Trucks' performances so far this season include two one-hitters, against Boston May 1 and Detroit July 6. The Orioles reached him for nine but their most serious threat fizzled in the eighth when Minnie Minoza made a fine running catch of Jim Brideweser's

long foul fly with the bases loaded and two out.

Bob Kuzava, making his first appearance for Baltimore since leaving the New York Yankees, was charged with the loss.

The White Sox failed to gain in the pennant race since Cleveland and the Yankees also won. The Indians edged Detroit 2-0. New York beat Philadelphia 1-1. Boston pounded Washington 10-1 in an afternoon game but lost to the Senators at night 5-4.

Cleveland leads the Yankees by three games and the White Sox by seven.

In the National League the Brooklyn Dodgers clipped the New York Giants' lead to 3 1/2 games with a 3-2 squeaker over Philadelphia. Third-place Milwaukee moved within seven games by shading St. Louis 6-5 in a game shortened to seven innings by rain. Cincinnati hit five home runs, beating Chicago, 8-1.

Ted Williams hit a pair of two-run homers, his 21st and 22nd of the season. In Boston's daylight triumph, his career total now is 339, good for a tie for sixth with Johnny Mize on the all-time list of home run sluggers.
