Disney Defends Scenes Of Birth In Real Life Movie

HOLLYWOOD — Walt Disney today defended one of his movies which has been criticized by the New York State Censor Board because it contains scenes showing a buffalo calf being born.
 "It's high time we started living in an up-to-date world," said the cartoon wizard. "You simply can't ignore such things as birth any more."
 The movie is "The Vanishing Prairie," one of Disney's true-life adventure films, a series which has won six Academy Awards. The New York censors have denied the film a license because it showed the birth of a buffalo calf.
 The action got Disney's dander up, and he's a fellow who doesn't madden easily. He claimed the board's thinking was outmoded.
 "There have been many scenes in these animal pictures which have thrown out for reasons of taste," he remarked. "But I felt this scene belonged in the film. It was a clean birth and very fast. I don't see how anyone could be touchy about it."
 A tiff with the censors is a rare event for Disney. He could recall only one or two others in the past.
 One time he portrayed a group of water sprites in a picture. The Johnston office raised an objection over the little fairies' navel. But Walt held his ground and refused to erase.
 "I had to give in another time," he added. "I think it was in 'Dumbo.' They objected to a winking navel."
 But he upheld the buffalo birth.
 "We didn't publicize the scene or try to sensationalize in any way," he said. "It's all done in the picture."
 The Disney studio pointed out that "The Vanishing Prairie" has been commended by the Parent-Teachers Assn., General Federation of Womens Clubs and other groups. Each recommended it for family audiences.
 "I can't understand the New York board," said Disney. "I grew up on a farm and saw all kinds of births when I was a boy. I think it helps give you a wholesome outlook on life."
 A tiff with the censors is a rare event for Disney. He could recall only one or two others in the past.

"I think it should be good for children. I know it had a good effect on my daughters. They're 18 and 20, and one is married. The scene took the fear out of child birth for them."
 "I showed the picture to the Catholic Legion of Decency in New York, and they found nothing objectionable in it. They said it should be seen not only by every adult, but every child, too."
 "Joe Breen (Hollywood's top censor) found nothing wrong with the scene. He told me to keep it in the picture."
 The Disney studio pointed out that "The Vanishing Prairie" has been commended by the Parent-Teachers Assn., General Federation of Womens Clubs and other groups. Each recommended it for family audiences.

Unity Fish Limit Raised

 Bag limit was raised to 30 fish per day since the reservoir is to be chemically treated in the near future to rid it of rough fish.

Farm Spray Uses Reported
TULELAKE — Scientists have found they can boost the killing time of insecticides up to 1,000 percent by using chemical "Extenders" according to Ken Baghetti, farm adviser.
 DDT used in an oil solution was effective less than 15 days, entomologists found. By adding methyl ethyl ketone they boosted the lethal period to 60 or more days. Aldrin and Lindane were improved even more.
 In normal oil or emulsion sprays they killed flies less than 10 days in outdoor weather conditions. Using the extender in place of the oil or emulsion, scientists obtained nearly perfect fly control for more than 102 days—an increase of over 1,000 per cent.
 The reason why oil-based sprays do not last is that the oil, carrying the DDT, penetrates the leaf. When a highly volatile solvent such as methyl ethyl ketone is substituted for the oil in DDT sprays, it quickly vaporizes, leaving a residue of DDT on the foliage surface. The residue does not wash or weather away easily.
