Mr. and Mrs. Glen Smith, Lakeview, were dinner guests at the Summer Lake Lodge Wednesday evening.

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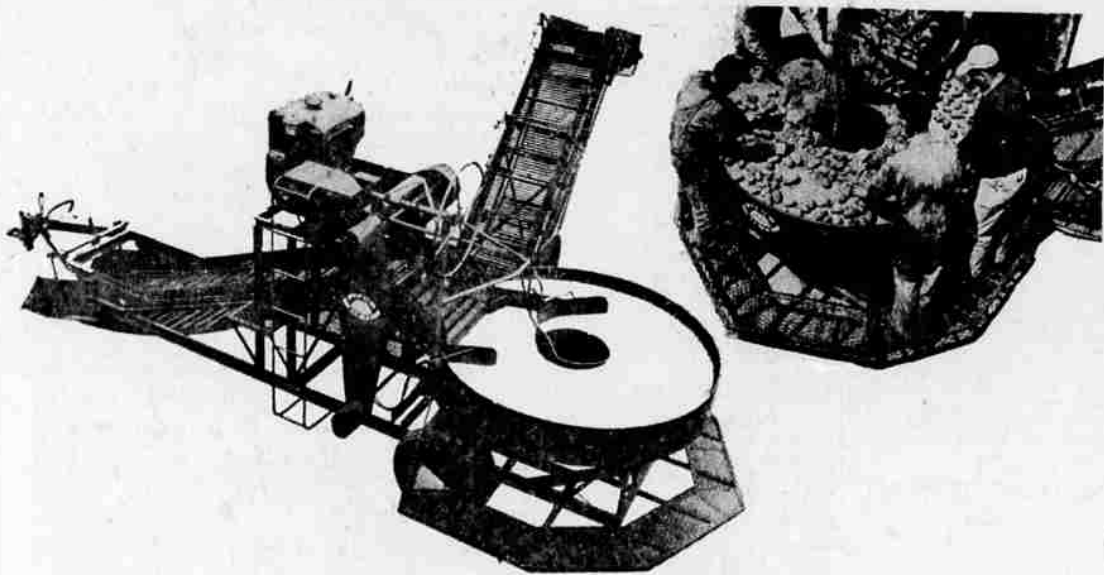
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
