

Grandmother's Club To Meet

The 13th annual National convention of Grandmother's Clubs will be held October 17-21 at the Olympic Hotel, Seattle. Plans for the convention are now being made by Mrs. Dorothea Sullivan, Chicago, national president who was in Klamath Falls recently to help organize the local club.

There are now 17,000 members in America. The federation of clubs is 16 years old. The group is social and educational and brings together older persons

whose families are raised. It is non-sectarian and non-partisan. There is no age limit.

Grandmother's Day has been designated as the second Sunday in October, which this year falls on October 10. Members are hoping to make it a national holiday by act of Congress.

Plans are underway for establishing a "Haven" building fund for the elderly in need. Contributions are being accumulated through the clubs only and there is no canvassing of individuals or business houses. Contributions are also given to research organization in the interest of health of children.

Permanent national headquarters have been established at 203 N. Wabash Avenue, Chicago. The national publishes a magazine Autumn Leaves four times a year that includes news of all the chapters, editorials, poetry and pictures.

Red Chinese Fete British

LONDON (AP)—Communist Chinese Premier Chou En-lai told former British Prime Minister Clement Attlee and his delegation of Labor party leaders last night he believes their tour of Red China "will play a positive role in strengthening the Chinese-British friendship."

Chou entertained the eight visiting Britons and 300 foreign diplomats and Chinese government officials at an elaborate banquet in Peiping punctuated by toasts and speeches at the beginning of each of the 10 courses.

British correspondents accompanying the Laborite delegation reported Attlee recalled that his Labor government had first recognized the Chinese Communists as their country's effective governors. He declared:

"Believing in freedom and democracy for ourselves, we seek that others should enjoy the right to order their lives in the way they think best."
