F. Rodgers and Emil Wells. ### Housing Profits To Be Probed

NEW YORK (AP)—A search for possible windfall profits from vast government-insured housing projects in the New York area begins today with opening of hearings by the Senate Banking Committee. Sen. Prescott G. Bush (R-Conn.), acting chairman and only member of the 15-man committee scheduled to be present for the four-day inquiry, said yesterday, "I hope we will get some criminal indictments as a result of this hearing." The committee has already conducted six weeks of hearings in Washington, where builders revealed they made millions in profits with relatively small investments on federal housing authority projects. Most of the risk was carried by taxpayers.
