TULELAKE — Consumers and representatives of the livestock and meat marketing industry have finished preparing their final statements and moved into Davis this week, according to Ken Baghott, Tulelake farm adviser. There they will take part in the first statewide California Livestock and Meat Marketing Conference, which will be held Tuesday and Wednesday, August 24 and 25, on the University of California campus.

Featuring the meeting will be the statements prepared after several months of study by the sponsoring groups including producers, sellers, transportation personnel, packers, jobbers and institutions, retailers and consumers.

Chairmen of the different groups are the following: consumers, Robert Mather, Oakland; producers, Kempton Clark, Woodland; sellers, co-chairmen, Stanley Breitweiser, Los Angeles, and Joe Sorenson, co-chairmen, Douglas Allen, San Francisco, and Cornelius Noble, Madera; retailers, Lawrence Bone, Oakland. Chairmen of the jobbers and institution groups are yet to be named.

Arrangements for housing overnight visitors and for providing meals have been completed by the university.

Rain Damages English Harvest

LONDON (AP)—Britain is facing the prospect of one of the worst harvests in years.

So much rain has poured on this island during the summer that the umbrella factories are far behind the demand.

Acres upon acres of green wheat is lying flat on the sodden earth with little or no hope of recovery.

The canning industry has seen its soft fruit pounded until its losses are estimated in millions of dollars.

In the counties of Kent, Berkshire, Sussex and Herefordshire there are reports of wheat sprouting as it lies flat on the wet earth before men and machines can get at it.

Canada Wheat Estimate Told

Canada's wheat crop for this year has been estimated at 513 million bushels. This is down 17 per cent from last year's harvested crop. It is also the smallest Canadian wheat crop since 1920.

The barley crop on the first of August was estimated at 222 million bushels. If realized, this will be down 49 million bushels from the 1953 crop. The acreage planted to barley in Canada this year was reported to be down about 12 per cent from last year and broke the upward trend in acreage since 1949.

The estimated oat crop this year is 381 million bushels, the smallest since 1949. It will also be 26 million bushels less than last year's output.

Canada's rye crop dropped off sharply from a year ago and is estimated at 16.2 million bushels. This compares with nearly 29 million bushels a year ago.

The acreage for most Canadian grain crops is down compared to a year ago. There is some increase in mixed grains. Canada's corn acreage, which is comparatively small, showed some increase compared to a year ago.

Rice Dropped To Flood Victims

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Government sources today said Chinese Nationalist planes flew deep into the Red Chinese mainland last night and dropped rice for victims of the Yangtze River flood. They also loosed hundreds of thousands of propaganda leaflets.

The sources said "many" planes took part in the mission and all returned safely to Formosa. The drops were reportedly made in Hopel, Hunan, Anhwei and Kiangsi provinces.

Lebanon Plans Huge Project

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP)—Little Lebanon is going to work on a 100-million-dollar river development project — biggest in its history — with no economic aid grants from foreign governments.

U.S. Point Four technicians conducted a three-year survey of the Litani River hydroelectric project, which is expected to double per capita consumption of electricity in Lebanon and irrigate more than 50,000 acres by the time it is finished in 25 years.

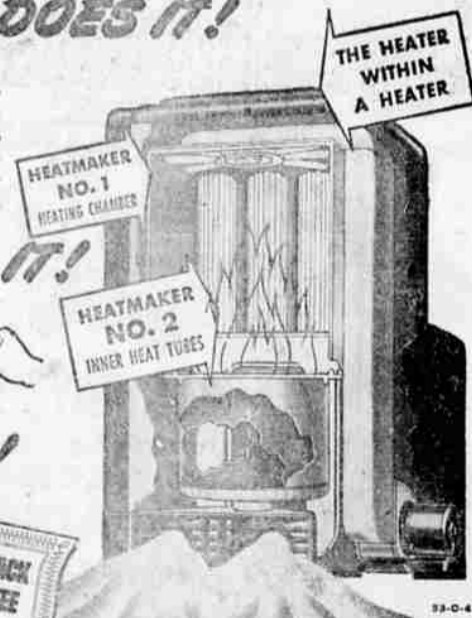
