3. A Superior Court judge ruled a mass picketing demonstration at the Rayonier Pulp plant at Hoquiam, Wash., last week was contempt of court but continued the hearing and said unions and individuals would have a chance to purge themselves.

4. The Kinsey Lumber Co. of Portland, charging breach of contract, filed suit in federal court for \$54,000 strike damages against AFL Local 2381.

5. At McCleary, Wash., members of Local 2761, AFL Lumber and Sawmill workers rejected a proposal by the Simpson Logging Co. the 609 striking men return to work at rates prevailing when the McCleary operation was closed by strike.
