

New Jersey Solon Backs Guy Cordon

PORTLAND — A former United States senator from New Jersey has voluntarily contributed \$250 to the Cordon for U.S. senator campaign, Senator Cordon's offices here announced today.

The contributor was Albert W. Hawkes of Montclair, N. J., who served in the U. S. Senate with Guy Cordon. Ex-Senator Hawkes said he was making the contribution to Senator Cordon's campaign because "I served with your Senator Guy Cordon. . . and know what he stands for."

In the letter accompanying his check, Hawkes wrote:

"I consider Guy Cordon a very able, honorable, intelligent and experienced, patriotic United States senator. He has something that many senators fail to show any evidence of having. That something is courage to do what he believes is right and in the interests of the people regardless of what anybody may say or think about him. I sincerely hope he may be elected by a very substantial majority in the State of Oregon, notwithstanding the fact that he will be opposed by those who would like to see our country become a socialistic nation. Guy wants our country to be a fine example of what a free democratic republic can be, where people have a fair opportunity to succeed and the government does not permit any to take undue advantage of other citizens."

"He is not in any sense a socialist but he is in favor of equity and he believes in the old rule of equity that he who asks equity must do equity and the other rule that he who comes into equity must do so with clean hands."

"I hope this little contribution may be helpful to you and I wish it might be 10 times as much as it is."

Klamath, Lake Teachers To Attend Annual Institute

Speakers prominent in the field of education will be present for sessions of the inservice program and institute for all teachers of Lake and Klamath counties, starting in Klamath Falls Monday, August 30 and continuing through Friday, September 3.

The week's program will include group and departmental meetings with emphasis on improved educational curriculums.

Scheduled to appear as speakers are Clark Brown, director of guidance and curriculum, Lake Oswego High School; Bertha S. Mason, M.D., child health program, San Jose City Health Department, who will give one of the major addresses; Melvin Murphy, executive director of the Mental Health Association of Oregon; Grace Rowe-Walington, director of placement and teacher training, San Jose State College; John H. Waterman, M.D., director of mental health section, Oregon State Board of Health, well-known for his work in this field in Klamath Falls; Dr. O. Meredith Wilson, president of the University of Oregon and Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction.

Separate sessions for city and county teachers will open the institute. All teachers will meet Wednesday, September 1 and Thursday, September 2 at Mills Auditorium. Split sessions will be returned on Friday, final day of the institute.

Small hours will break the study schedule with a barbecue at 5 p.m. on Modoc Field, planned for September 1, for all teachers and guests.

Friday, final day, is "Industry Education Day." Following a general assembly at 9 a.m. at Mills School the educators will be divided into small groups under the direction of R. Frank Tucker, manager of the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce, to visit
