Federal Funds Aid Fisheries

WASHINGTON — Senator Guy Cordon reports that \$94,963 has been apportioned by the federal government to Oregon for sport fishery restoration projects during the current fiscal year.

The federal funds are made available to the state under the terms of the Dingell - Johnson act of 1950. This program, now in its fourth year, is enabling the states to create new public fishing lakes, restore many unproductive waters, and put research findings to better use.

The revenue for the federal share of the program comes from the 19 per cent excise tax on fishing rods, reels, and artificial lures, baits and flies, paid by manufacturers.

Under law, the federal government will pay 75 per cent of the cost of approved restoration projects. Thus, if Oregon uses the full federal allocation, its contribution to the projects will be more than \$126,000 the total amount available for the work in the state.

To provide a fair distribution of federal funds, each state's share is based on the relation of its number of paid fishing license holders to the total in all the states, and the ratio of each state's area, including coastal waters, to the area of the entire country.
