Red Atrocities To Be Told

CLEVELAND (AP)—Eight more witnesses come before a House subcommittee on Communist aggression today to add their stories to testimony that rape, beatings and book-burnings attended the Reds' postwar seizure of control in Hungary.

In an ornate federal courtroom, Rep. Alvin M. Bentley (R-Mich), subcommittee chairman, and Rep. Michael A. Feighan, Cleveland Democrat, listened yesterday while seven persons recalled painful memories of atrocities, persecution and deception.

The Soviets had planned the post-

war government of Hungary even before that nation surrendered in World War II, Dr. Geza Teleki told the subcommittee yesterday. He spoke of his fight as minister of education to keep the Russians from dominating Hungary's schools.

The 43-year-old Teleki, now a professor of political geography at the University of Virginia, said he was one of three patriots who snaked through Gestapo lines to petition to Allied forces in Moscow

for surrender. Once there, he said, the three had no choice but to sign an agreement offered them by Foreign Minister Molotov.
