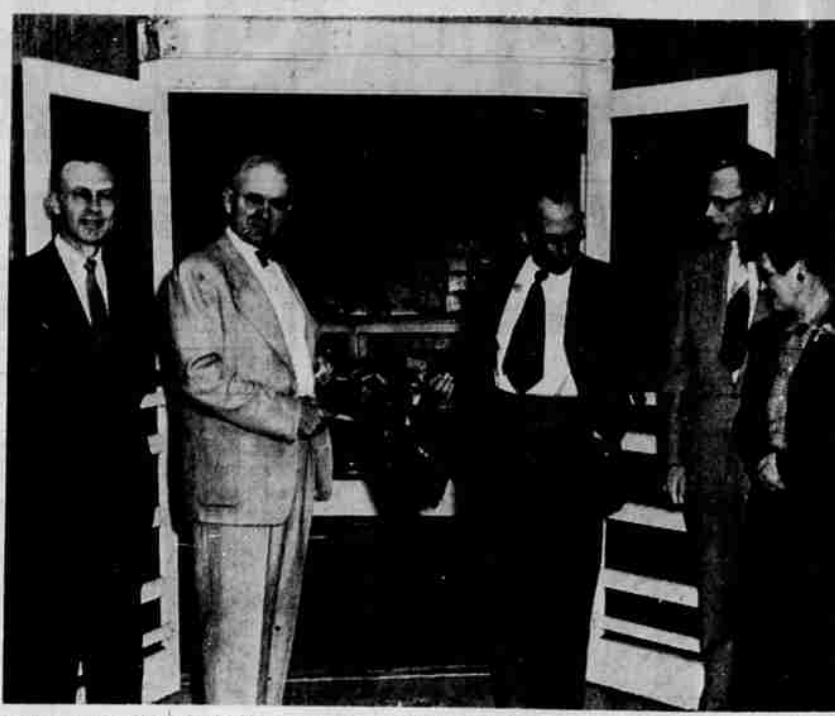

Field Workers Study Plan For Migrant Workers Aid

TULELAKE — Church members of the Klamath Basin, pastors, head of organizations and others will combine forces this year to work out plans in the interest of children of migrant families who will arrive soon for the potato harvest. First steps were taken at a meeting this week at the Sportman's Hotel.

Betty Jane Whitaker, Portland, fieldworker for the National Council of Churches will spend several weeks here this fall to supervise the proposed program of education, recreation and distribution of clothing in the migrant camps at Tulelake and Malin. She will be assisted in the planning program by Edith Mason, Portland, member of the State Migrant Committee of Oregon and Miss Hunter, social worker, also of Portland.

Churches of Tulelake, Merrill, Malin, Mt. Laki, Newell, Dorris and Klamath Falls have signified interest in promoting the plan.

Mrs. A. E. Ryckman has been appointed general chairman for Tulelake with Mrs. Webb Bowen assisting. Mrs. Dan Crawford will chair the committee to recruit volunteer help assisted by Mrs. Ross England and Mrs. Carl Jensen. Mrs. Dick Moore has been appointed to head the recreation committee. Mrs. Roy Heiney will be chairman of the clothing drive.

Efforts of the groups will be directed principally toward youth and tentative plans call for a church school, after school club, family nights, field trips, nature studies and other entertainment for children who otherwise would be left to their own devices while

Ice Breakers Pioneer Route

WASHINGTON (AP)—Two government ice breakers have pioneered a "Northwest Passage," cutting through a frozen barrier on the shortest all-water route linking the Atlantic and Pacific oceans.

A longer route through the ice fields north of the Arctic Circle — sought by explorers since the days of Columbus — was navigated in 1906.

Although the U.S. ships didn't make the complete passage from one ocean to the other, they plowed their way through the only major obstacle to such a trip.

Announcement of the historic voyages was made yesterday by the Navy. It said the Navy ice breaker Burton Island and the Coast Guard's North Wind were the first to push their way through the McClure Strait, connecting the Arctic Ocean and Viscount Melville Sound.

The new route is choked with heavy ice floes and will have no commercial value. But it does make a significant achievement for science and exploration — and, doubtless, for military authorities concerned with that part of the Western Hemisphere closest to Soviet Russia.
