### Wildlife Fund Allotted State

WASHINGTON — Senator Guy Cordon reports that \$239,372 has been apportioned by the federal government to Oregon for the restoration and development of the state's wildlife resources during the current fiscal year. The amount becomes available to the state's game department under the terms of the Pittman-Robertson act, as administered by the Fish and Wildlife Service. To obtain federal grants for wildlife projects, the state must contribute \$1 for every \$3 in federal funds. This, Senator Cordon pointed out, if Oregon fully matches the federal allocation, more than \$813,000 will be available in the state this year for wildlife development and restoration. In making the state allotments from a \$10,000,000 fund, representing the amount collected from the 11 per cent federal excise tax levied on manufacturers of sporting arms and ammunition, the Interior Department uses this formula: One-half the sum to be apportioned is divided according to the ratio which the area of each state bears to the area of all states. The remaining half is divided on the number of paid license holders in all states.

### Safety Team Investigates B-36 Crash

EL PASO, Tex. (AP) — The Air Force has sent crack investigating teams from flight safety headquarters to help probe crashes of two giant B36 bombers within 24 hours that left 25 dead and 18 injured. One of the 10-engine planes, trying to land but crippled by apparent power failure, smashed into an open patch near a big housing project on the El Paso outskirts Saturday night. It disintegrated into a fiery, exploding heap. One crewman was killed and 15 injured.

The night before, 24 crewmen died and three were critically hurt when another B36 crashed at Rapid City, S.D., while approaching Ellsworth Air Force Base for a landing in "perfect" weather. This was the worst crackup in the history of the world's largest bomber valued at 3 1/2 million dollars.

The Air Force announced in Washington yesterday formal boards of inquiry in both smashups would be helped by teams en route from its flight safety headquarters at Norton AFB, San Bernardino, Calif.

The announcement said B36 crews last year set the lowest accident rate of any in the Strategic Air Command. For the first six months of this year, the Air Force said, the B36 accident rate was nine per 100,000 flying hours compared with an average of 14 for all types of SAC aircraft. The B36 that crashed Saturday

night was from Biggs AFB near the city on the U.S.-Mexico border. It was returning from a 10-hour training flight. Base officials said it made one landing pass at Biggs, circled and started another when power failed and the commander, Maj. L. D. Lanier of El Paso, asked permission for an emergency landing at El Paso International Airport. This was granted, but the crew was un-

able to keep the big ship aloft. It smashed into an unpopulated area near the International Airport and burst into flames. The fatality was identified as A. C. Ronald A. Straszheim of Buffalo, N.Y. Witnesses said the four jet engines were still running when the ship hit. Unofficial cause was placed on failure of the plane's six conventional engines.

### Singer Injured In Auto Mishap

CHICAGO (AP) — Singer Frankie Laine and his wife suffered minor injuries yesterday in a traffic accident. Laine was treated by a physician for a back injury and shoulder bruise, his wife for a bruise on her left arm. Elmer Givens, 48, who drove the automobile which collided with a taxicab in which the Laines were riding, was charged with failure to yield the right-of-way.

PASCAGOULA, Miss. (AP) — Sgt. Michael Hanyok of Barnesboro, Pa., was electrocuted yesterday when he stepped on a highway to give help at the scene of a wreck. Corporal J. L. Grimsley said a car driven by Mrs. Fred Newby of Pascagoula crashed into a pole supporting a 22,000-volt power line and snapped the line. Hanyok, stationed at Keesler Air Force Base, stepped on the line as he got out of his car to help. His wife Eleanor and 3-week-old daughter Patricia Ann were severely burned. Mrs. Newby was not seriously injured.
