

Norblad Sends Navy Protest

ASTORIA (AP) — Rep. Walter Norblad protested in a letter to the secretary of the Navy what he said was "absolute waste of taxpayers' money" in Navy surplus disposal here.

Norblad said he was "amazed to find that every one of the several thousand items" offered for sale to the highest bidder at a surplus sale at Tongue Point Naval Station here, "were absolutely new and almost all of them usable by the Navy department or some other agency."

Cordon Speaks In John Day

JOHN DAY (AP) — Sen. Guy Cordon, campaigning for reelection, said here Tuesday night that he will not vote for a dollar of federal appropriation "which is not absolutely necessary to the government for its own defense or for a service to the American people which they can't perform themselves."

The Oregon congressman called upon the Navy to reorganize its disposal program "so that these new and usable items will either not be over-produced or will be held by the Navy for future use rather than being sold at bargain counter rates."

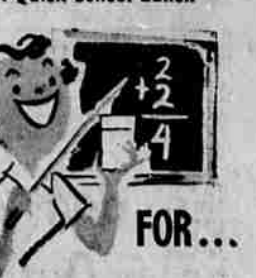
