 Foreign Ministry sources said Nehru is scheduled to leave Oct. 16 for a two-week stay, returning the visit Red Chinese Premier Chou En-lai paid him last June en route home from the Geneva conference.

Safety Council Urges Caution

CHICAGO (AP)—Summer's last long weekend lured millions of Americans to the highways, rails, waters and skies today.
 From the big cities there was a general Labor Day exodus to beaches, mountains, national and state parks and similar tourist attractions. Railroads, air lines and bus companies added special equipment and crews to carry the holiday load.
 The National Safety Council estimated that millions of automobiles will choke the roads and that 300 persons will be killed in traffic mishaps in the 78 hours between 8 p.m. today and midnight Monday.
 The council urged every motorist to use caution, drive at reduced speed and observe the rules and courtesies of the road.
 In Michigan, where license plates proclaim the state a "water-wonderland" for tourists and vacationers, Gov. G. Mennen Williams has declared a state of emergency over the weekend to keep traffic deaths down. National Guard units are helping patrol the roads.

Hollywood 'Finds' Famed Saga Of Lewis And Clark

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Hollywood is discovering those famed discoverers Lewis and Clark.
 It never rains but what it pours. For 50 years, the movie industry virtually ignored the saga of Lewis and Clark, one of the great adventures in American history. Then suddenly everyone hops on the bandwagon.
 The Motion Picture Assn. which records suggested titles to avoid conflicts among the studios, reports that no less than 18 titles have been registered for Lewis and Clark movies. Warner Brothers announced plans for such a film in Cinemascope and laid aside five possible titles for it.
 Walt Disney registered two titles, as did Howard Welsh and Clover Productions. Columbia, RKO, MGM, 20th-Fox, Harold Hecht and Joseph Bernhard have reserved one apiece.
 Of course, all of these films won't be made. But movie audiences will be getting a sizable supply of the Lewis and Clark lives and legends. First of the films will be "Two Captains West," with Fred MacMurray and Charlton Heston as the famed explorers. Those canny producers, Pine and Thomas kept the project secret so they could get the film to the market before their competitors.
 Here are some of the interesting facts uncovered by research for the production:
 President Jefferson bought the Louisiana Territory for \$23,213,000 from Napoleon, who needed the money. The President made an ideal selection for the two men to explore the vast region. Meriwether Lewis had been his secretary. The 33-year-old Virginian was a lieutenant in the Army.
 He had served with his good friend, Capt. William Clark, 29-year-old Kentuckian. Jefferson apparently mentored Lewis to be in command of the expedition. But Lewis accepted Clark as his co-leader, saying, "Your situation will be in all respects precisely such as my own."
 The cost of the trip: \$2,500. Congress appropriated that minor sum for supplies. Most of the men were on regular salary with the Army.
 The group left St. Louis May 14, 1804, returned there Sept. 23, 1806. The crew: Lewis and Clark.
