# KF Service Clubs Hear Rilea W. Doe

"The person who presumes to criticize our defense establishment today (not four or five years ago) had better stick to selling groceries, shoes, or insurance, and leave the management of our defense qualified gentlemen who now direct it."

That was a statement of Rilea W. Doe, vice president of Safety Stores, Inc., to members of the Kiwanis and Rotary clubs in a joint session Thursday noon at the Willard Hotel.

Doe recently spent a week watching all phases of our military in combat demonstrations. He recounted nearly unbelievable accomplishments in technical developments and in training and timing by the services.

He said that the Army's Chief of Staff, Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, gave what to him was the keynote of our armed security with this statement: "The military is no stronger than the conviction and the understanding of those who create it, support it, and depend upon it for protection."

Answering the question, "How

can we help our Department of Defense?" he recommended that we:

1. Quit calling our military top leaders "The Brass." It lowers prestige down through the ranks to lower the self-respect for the uniform.
2. Give your employees who are in the "reserves" some special consideration. It's either support the reservist or the Defense Department must keep more men in uniform all the time.
3. Make up your mind that defense costs money. If an armored

vest, one of the cheapest items of equipment, costs \$30, don't squawk. If it's worth it for your boy it's worth it for all boys.

"Every month or so new atomic or electronic devices make obsolete last month's favorites. Under-

stand this, and let's don't make targets of ourselves by moaning about every obsolete boat or truck or gun you see unused. That's why war is really hell," he counseled.

# TV Actress Dies In Crash

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A fiery automobile crash in the Hollywood Hills yesterday killed the actress who played Joan Davis' best friend in the comedienne's television films.

A New York newspaperman was critically injured and two other persons were less seriously hurt.

Dead is Mrs. Geraldine Carneol, 37, known professionally as Geraldine Carr. She had portrayed the role of the next-door neighbor Mabel in about 20 of the past 28 Joan Davis TV shows.

Ned Russell, Washington correspondent for the New York Herald Tribune, suffered a skull fracture and multiple cuts.

The others hurt in the accident were the actress' husband, Jess Carneol, 45, a musician, and Mrs. Pearl Fies, 37. Both are recovering.

Carneol told officers Russell was driving the group home from a private swimming party. The accelerator pedal apparently jammed. The car sideswiped another, hit a wall and overturned. Nearby residents and other motorists pulled the four victims from the burning wreckage. James G. Luter, 22, of Los Angeles, driver of the other car, was unhurt.
