

Holden, Lum Sweep H-N Net Meet



Bay Area Netter Tops Men

A smooth and consistent tennis playing fireman from San Francisco swept through the seventh annual Herald and News Tennis Tournament over the three-day Labor Day holiday to cop the men's singles championship held at Moore Park Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

John Holden, playing near perfect tennis displayed plenty of court savvy to work his way into the finals of the annual tourney and beat Ken Karnes of Redding by 6-2 and 6-4 set scores.

The deceptive looking netter from San Francisco used a smooth swinging backhand and a powerful forehand to master four opponents in his three day stay.

Holden gained the finals against the four time tournament champion by posting wins over Bud Case by 6-1 and 6-3 margins, Don Willner of Portland by 6-0 and 7-5 set scores, and then whipping Norm Merrill of Portland in the semi-finals as he wearily battled to a 6-3, 6-2 verdict over the Oregon State College student.

Barbara Lum from Oswego and the Oregon state women's titlist replaced Kay O'Bryon as the women's singles champion after the Redding net star had turned in four victories in the six years of the tournament's history.

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Lum met O'Bryon in the finals yesterday morning and both of the court stars battled on even terms in the first set until the dean of girls at Oswego High School won an 8-6 decision. In the second set Lum repeated her victory, at this time by a 6-2 margin.

Lum gained the finals with wins over Gertrude Brooks of Klamath Falls by identical set scores of 6-0 and 6-0, then the state champion set Windy Mansfield, last year's runnerup, down by 6-0 and 6-1 set scores.

In the men's doubles competition, Dr. Raymond Tice kept part of the tournament's honor in Klamath as he teamed with Ellis Williamson of Eureka and the two topped all competition for the tourney's championship.

The pair of court veterans swept through their matches with wins over Shannon Oldham and Bill Benson 6-0 and 6-1, then they moved into the finals by whipping Jerry Doyle and Willner of Portland with 7-5 and 6-2 set scores. In the finals they beat the youthful combination of Merrill and Terry Wagner of Redding, but the vets took the first set 10-8 and then came back to post a 6-4 decision over the teen-age netters for the title.

Again it was the story of Lum and Holden when the trophies were presented to the winners of the mixed division, as the women's and men's singles champs teamed together to win the mixed competition.

In the finals it was the runner-up from the men's and women's, O'Bryon and Karnes against the champions of the two divisions. The Redding pair put on a desperate battle but fell before the victorious pair but only after three sets, by 6-3, 6-8 and another 6-3 decision.

Holden and Lum won their first

round match from Willner and Gertrude Brooks 6-2 and 6-2, then went on to beat Williamson and Mansfield in the semi-finals by 6-0 and 6-3 set scores.

Terry Wagner, the ex-Redding High School tennis star put a stopper to Merrill's try for a second successive junior men's title yesterday as the California youth posted two straight set victories over the state junior men's champion by close 6-3 and 6-4 margins.

This year's tournament was sparked by several top 11 high school players such as the O'Bryon-Lum match and then the three set match featuring little Patty Miller, the 14 year old that stirred many conversations from the gallery, proved too much for the up and coming netter from Portland as she won by 6-4, 1-6 and 6-4 scores.

In men's action Merrill probably pulled the biggest comeback of the meet as he dropped a 6-0 set score to Earl Brooks of Klamath in their first set, then the Portland youth came back to take two straight sets by tough 9-7 and 8-6 margins. Another good match was the semi-finals battle between Williamson and Karnes, as the latter came from behind to score a 1-6, 7-5 and 6-3 verdict over last year's runner-up.

Men's doubles action was highlighted by Doyle and Willner's win over Brooks and Karnes in the opening round as the two teams battled into three sets before a winner was proclaimed. The pair from Portland tripped Brooks and Karnes after losing the first set 9-11, then coming back to take 7-5 and 7-5.
