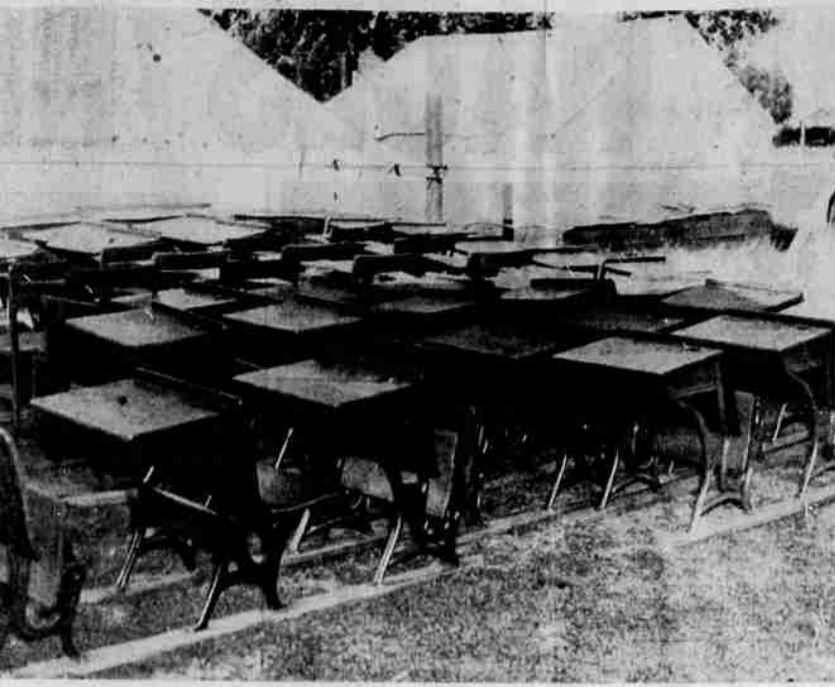

Dewey To Tell Election Plans
 ALBANY, N.Y. (AP)—Republican Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York will end the long speculation over his political plans tonight, and a source close to the governor says his announcement will be that he will not run for a fourth term.
 Instead, according to the source, Dewey is expected to endorse Sen. Irving M. Ives for the Republican gubernatorial nomination.
 The governor's office announced yesterday that Dewey would reveal his intentions in statewide television and radio broadcasts.
 His speech, from New York City, will be carried over a CBS television network from 8 to 8:15 p.m. EDT, and rebroadcast over CBS radio from 10:15 to 10:30 p.m. EDT.
 If the governor calls it a day, he is expected to say that he will return to law practice in Manhattan after he has completed his third term on Dec. 31.
 Dewey, twice defeated in bids for the presidency, was elected governor in 1942 and was returned by large majorities in 1946 and 1950.
 Ives has said repeatedly that he does not want to run for governor, but friends say that he will be available if Dewey bows out.

Koreans Discuss U. S. Withdrawal
 SEOUL (AP)—South Korea's top military leaders, back from conferences in Washington, met with President Syngman Rhee today. Sources said they discussed the planned withdrawal of two thirds of American troops from Korea and probable buildup of South Korean military forces.

Reds Returning Allied War Dead
 PANMUNJOM (AP)—The Communists today told the U.N. Command they will return 300 Allied war dead tomorrow, including the remains of 296 Americans, 3 Britons and 1 Australian.
 The U.S. Army said the first ship carrying remains of Korean War dead returned by the Communists will sail from Pusan tomorrow for Kookura, Japan. The remains will be examined at the Army's graves registration laboratory at Kookura to establish scientifically accurate identification.
 In the exchange today the United Nations received 279 Americans and 21 British war dead. The U.N. handed back 600 Communist bodies.

AERIAL RAIDS
 LONDON (AP)—A Conservative and a Laborite newspaper both urged the United States Tuesday to choke off further aerial raids on the Chinese mainland by the Formosa forces of Nationalist leader Chiang Kai-Shek.

Esther Williams To Leave On First Big Theater Tour

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—This year Esther Williams goes out to meet the public "dry." Next year she'll be "wet."
 The celebrated swimming star is leaving on her first big theater and night club tour. No, she won't be swimming this time. She'll appear in a musical act that will kick her amphibious movie epics.
 I caught the act at The Trails, where she debuted over the weekend. It is a westside Los Angeles night spot which, oddly enough, is owned by Esther and her husband Ben Gage. The latter co-stars with Esther, and a feature of the act is a glamorous water curtain that surrounds the swimming star. It was built at a machine shop owned by the Gages.
 The act looked good in preview form. There was much dancing about by Esther and a chorus of five singers and dancers. There was much jesting about Esther and her liquefied existence.
 After doing a strenuous mambo number, Esther came panting over to explain how she got involved in the whole deal.
 "My agents have been after me for some time to go out on tour," she said. "At first, there was the idea of putting a tank on the stage of the Winter Garden in New York, the way they did for 'Wish You Were Here.' They proposed putting a mirror above the pool, so the audience could see me."
 "That didn't sound right to me. When I got out on a swimming tour, I want it to be done big."
 "Then they got the idea of going out with a 'dry' tour. I said no at first. I didn't know what I could do. I would feel literally like a fish out of water."
 "But they told me, 'You don't realize how much entertaining you have learned in the pictures and danced all kinds of musical numbers.' My agents sold the act to Bill Miller of the Las Vegas Sahara before I even consented to it. They knew I would agree when that happened. The Las Vegas salaries are simply unbelievable."
 The show has been whipped up with Esther, Ben, the chorus, a baby elephant, an acrobatic act and a comedian.
 The tour will take over two months and may be extended. Then Esther has to report back to her chieftain at MGM. But next year she has even bigger plans.
 "That's when we want to do our water show and world tour," she said. "We will put on a big show with 20 swimmers in arenas like Madison Square Garden."
 The plans include a huge pool made of plastic for portability and circular for stress resistance.
