Blind Man's Robber Held

A transient who was stopped for questioning by Southern Pacific Special Officer Champlin early this morning near the S.P. depot, was later identified as the man who robbed Pete Jones of about \$40 Monday afternoon. Jones who is blind, is the operator of the cigar stand on the Fourth and Main Street corner of the courthouse lawn.

First giving his name as Hoyt Kesterson, the man later admitted to city police his name was Delbert Stewart and signed a statement admitting he had robbed the blind man while he was talking on the telephone.

Several articles found in a canvas zipper bag carried by Stewart were identified as part of the stolen goods taken from Jones.

In addition to the money several cartons of cigarettes, candy and an electric razor were taken. Stewart is being held in the city jail on a robbery charge.

Tulelake City Bonds Sold

TULELAKE — The Bank of America, purchaser of the city's \$35,000 issue of sewer bonds, paid the lowest interest in the history of the city's several bond issues according to Mrs. Victoria Thaler, city clerk.

Average paid was 3.26 per cent in comparison to former rates of 4.75 and 5 per cent.

Sale of the bonds guarantees an immediate start on construction of the sewer lines that will service the new residential district and the Tulelake-Butte Valley Fairgrounds.

Low bidder for construction was the Pat Barclay Company, San Jose. Completion is set for October.
