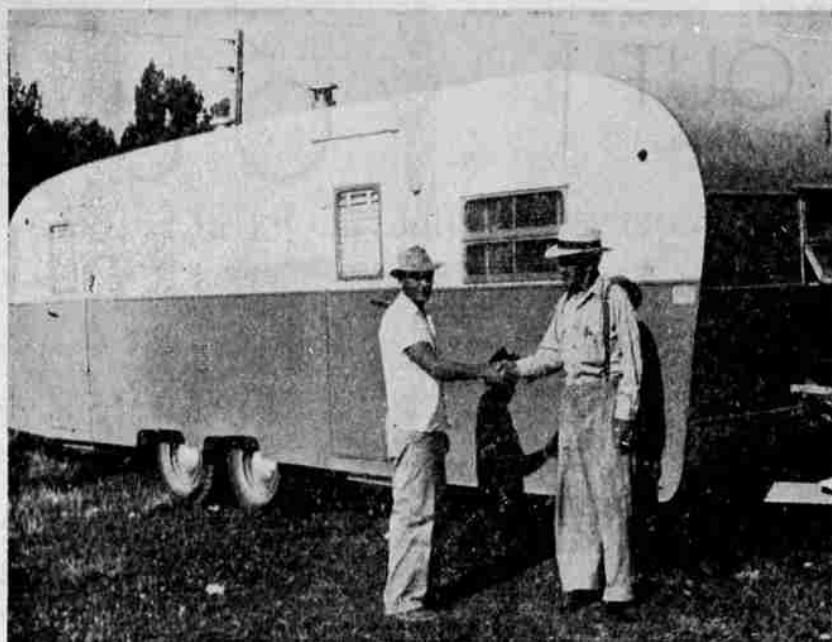

Rain Fails To Halt Record Attendance At State Fair

SALEM (AP) — The rains came to the Oregon State Fair Tuesday, but had held off long enough to permit record attendance over the Labor Day weekend.

Monday's attendance was 73,230, compared with last year's Labor Day crowd of 62,870. The attendance Sunday was 85,675.

Attendance at the night vaudeville show, horse races and the circus also is setting new marks. However, betting at the races is running behind last year.

The kiddies will have their annual day Wednesday, when all rides will be 10 cents for children under 12 years of age until 5 p. m.

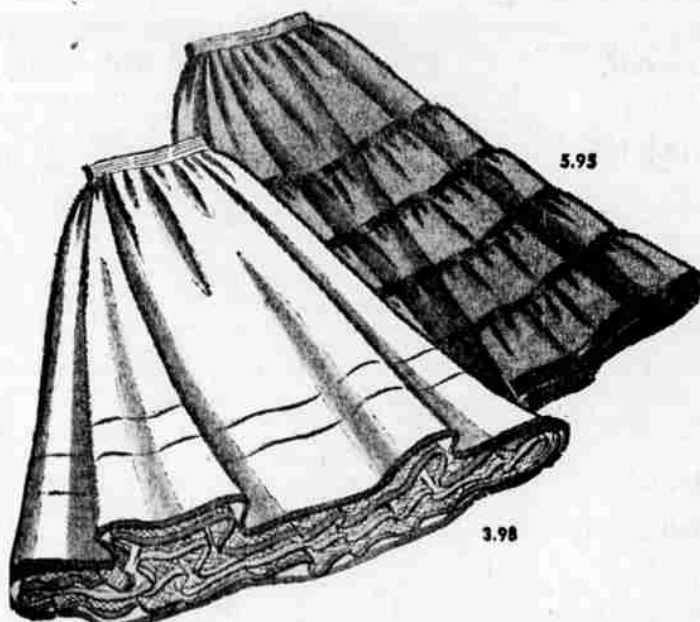

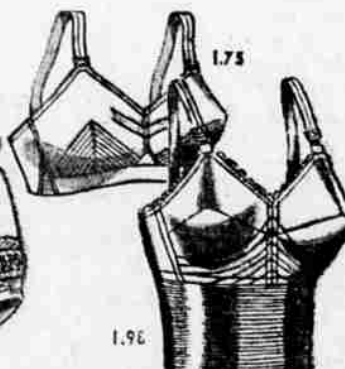

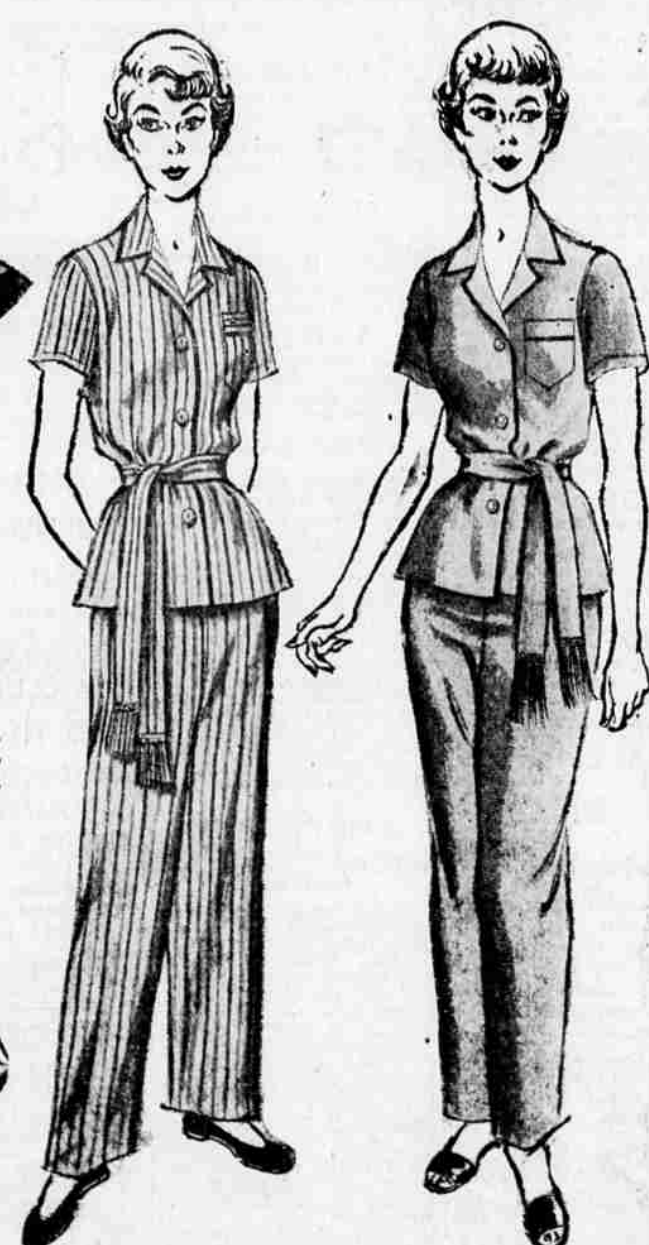
