

Veteran Screen Actress To Open New Television Show

HOYWOOD (AP)—Ginger Rogers is leaping into television the hard way with a strenuous, 11-hour live show.

After a couple of years of romancing with TV, the star is ready to go. She'll make her debut (except for an appearance on the Oscar telecast) on NBC Oct. 18. The show will be the first of the "spectaculars" produced by Leland Hayward. Show time is 8 p.m. and the layout is obviously designed to knock I Love Lucy out of its supremacy.

Ginger will appear in three plays from Noel Coward's "Tonight at 8.30"—"Red Peppers," "Shadow

Play" and "Still Life." The latter was the basis for the film "Brief Encounter," and its star, Trevor Howard, will appear opposite Ginger.

Isn't she scared with such a heavy schedule? "No," she replied. "It means a lot of hard work. But then, I've never been allergic to work. The memorizing doesn't throw me either. I have a habit of memorizing whole plays, so I can throw a cue if it is needed."

"The only thing that worries me is the changes of costumes. I don't see how I am going to get into so many outfits in an hour and a half. But I suppose they will figure it out."

I saw Ginger over breakfast coffee on the veranda of her hill-top home overlooking the Beverly Hills. She looked as youthful as ever and enthused about the activity her career is enjoying.

"I never rains but what it pours," she said. "I'll sit around for months, and then suddenly I'll be so busy I don't know what to do."

Before leaving for New York and the TV show, she has to make a Columbia picture, "Dead Pigeon," in which she'll play a Roxie Hartlike gal who comes out of prison to be a reluctant state's witness. After the TV show, she goes on the road for two weeks to help sell "Twist of Fate," which she made in England with her husband Jacques Bergerac. Coming out at the same time will be her latest picture, "Black Widow," in which she plays her first killer.

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Dulles, Chiang Confer As Nationalists Pound Reds

TAIPEH, Formosa (AP)—Nationalist warships and planes pounded the Red China coast again today, even as U.S. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles pledged that Nationalist China "doesn't stand alone against the forces of aggression."

Dulles flew here from the Southeast Asia security conference in Manila and spent 2 hours and 15 minutes, closed with President Chiang Kai-shek.

A high Nationalist official said "they exchanged views on questions affecting the two countries. The result was satisfactory to both."

U.S. Ambassador Carl Rankin described the talk as very cordial and longer than expected.

Only five hours after Dulles' special plane landed here he and his party were airborne again, headed for Tokyo.

In a statement read to newsmen at the airport, he reiterated that the U.S. 7th Fleet is under orders to guard Formosa.

RED ACTIVITY

He said Communist China now is intensifying military and propaganda activity against the Nationalists "but we shall not be intimidated."

This statement was viewed here as a direct and challenging reply to Communist threats to "liberate" an endorsement of Nationalist attacks on Amoy and satellite bases from which the Reds have shelled the Nationalist Island base of Quemoy.

Amoy is only five miles from Quemoy, just off the China coast 120 miles west of Formosa.

A Defense Ministry communique issued as Dulles and Chiang were talking said Nationalist warplanes bombed and strafed military targets at Amoy and along the coast.

BOMBARDING

At the same time, the communique said, Nationalist warships bombarded Amoy and nearby Wuyi Island and patrolled waters off Quemoy and Amoy.

Young Lincoln's Tombstone Found

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (AP) — The tombstone of Abraham Lincoln's second son Eddie has been found by historians after being missing for 89 years.

Broken and lying face down, it was discovered serving as an entrance stone to the Oak Ridge Cemetery burial plot of the family of Ninian Edwards, Illinois' third governor.

The body of Eddie, who died in 1850, six weeks before his fourth birthday, lies entombed with that of his father's short distance away. The whereabouts of the tombstone, a white marble slab, had been unknown since 1865, when Eddie's body was moved from a Springfield cemetery.

The stone was located by a photographer compiling a record of grave markers of Springfield persons associated with Lincoln.

OSAKA, Japan (AP)—Police here may have to hold a lottery to decide the owner of a \$5,555 winning lottery ticket found in a gutter yesterday by a 23-year-old woman. Six persons already have put in claims.

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
