**Gamma Globulin Made Available**  
 BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) - Cutter Laboratories of Berkeley has announced that gamma globulin will be available to physicians through normal channels starting Oct. 1st. Heretofore, gamma globulin has been allocated only to polio danger areas or to exposed persons through the Office of Defense Mobilization and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. The serum has been used for the prevention or modification of polio and measles and for protection against infectious hepatitis.

## Crop Control End Urged

TWIN FALLS, Idaho (AP) - Secretary of Agriculture Benson said Thursday he hoped that crop controls can be ended ultimately under flexible price supports. Speaking in Idaho's richest farm county, he criticized rigid, high supports, saying: "It's just as wasteful to spend billions on outdated farm programs as on outdated planes, ships and guns." The secretary's remarks were prepared for a rally in which Idaho's Republican leaders fired the opening gun in their 1954 election campaign.

"If we want to keep America strong," Benson declared, "we cannot afford the luxury of programs that weaken the self-reliance and the gumption of producers." Benson said he hoped flexible supports eventually would do away with the need for all acreage controls. But controls are still necessary in some areas, he said, because of "years of wartime incentives in peacetime" and surpluses "acquired under high rigid supports."
