

## Ex-President of Guatemala Flies Into Mexican Exile

MEXICO CITY (AP)—Ex-President Jacobo Arbenz Guzman of Guatemala flew into Mexican exile today as threatening crowds screamed "Assassins! Criminals! Genocides!" at his departure from his homeland.

The chief of Guatemala's ousted pro-Communist regime landed here before dawn in a special Mexican plane. He was accompanied by his wife, their two young sons and 17 of his supporters.

## Japanese Wheat Mission Planned

TOKYO (AP)—The Canadian embassy announced a three-man Japanese wheat mission will leave for Canada Monday by Canadian Pacific Air Lines for a three week study of Canada's wheat handling methods.

J. C. Britton, charge d'affaires, said the trip is sponsored by the Canadian Wheat Board of the Ministry of Trade and Commerce. The three-man team is composed of Shinsaku Egami of the Ministry of Agriculture, Kohei Yamanouchi of the Mission Flour Mills and Masateru Yamagami of the Nippon Flour Mills.

The team will be greeted in Vancouver by a Japanese embassy member of the Wheat Board.

They will tour Canada's great wheat country, visiting Calgary, Winnipeg, Ottawa, Toronto and wheat shipping center of Port Arthur on the Great Lakes.

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All had been refugees, with hundreds of others, in the Mexican embassy in Guatemala since the forces of Lt. Col. Carlos Castillo Armas forced Arbenz out of office June 27.

Castillo, now Guatemala's president, finally granted the refugees safe conduct permits out of the country in accordance with the traditional Latin-American right of political asylum. But the new Guatemalan regime announced it would seek the extradition of those wanted for numerous murders, tortures and other crimes it has laid to the former government.

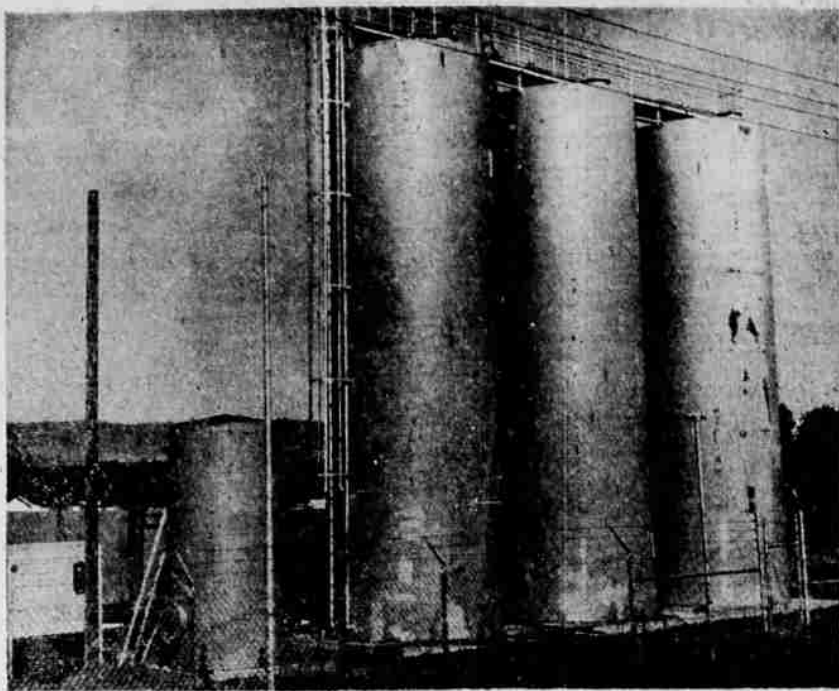
Associated Press Correspondent Alvaro Contreras reported from Guatemala City that strong cordons of military police were needed to protect Arbenz from the large and angry crowds which gathered last night, first at the Mexican embassy and later at the airfield.

The ex-president and his party were spirited out of a back door and taken safely to the airport by a circuitous route.

At the airfield, the Guatemalan customs officials forced the ex-president to undergo as they made a thorough examination. Arbenz met this with angry glances but otherwise did not say a word before he boarded the plane.

Among those accompanying him into exile were Jose Manuel Fortuny, secretary of the Guatemalan Communist party, and Col. Carlos Enrique Diaz, ex-chief of the armed forces who had taken over the government for 34 hours after Arbenz resigned.

After the plane's departure, the crowd surrounded Mexican Ambassador Villa Michel and members of his staff, shouting "Communists!" The Mexicans were rushed to their cars by a large military escort and back to the embassy.

## Small Boy Dies From Rabies

DALLAS, Tex. (AP)—A 9-year-old boy died from rabies Friday only hours after he was admitted to Parkland Hospital, clawing, biting and spitting.

The child was Ben Earl Ivery, the youngest of nine children of Mrs. Vessie Ivery.

The boy was first taken to Parkland July 18 after he was bitten by a stray dog, but his case was not diagnosed as rabies until yesterday, the mother said.

Ben Earl was the second Dallas child to die with rabies this summer. Jody Allene Brown, 3, died

a few weeks ago. The State Health Department Thursday listed no other deaths from the maddening malady this year. The two children lived within a mile of one another.



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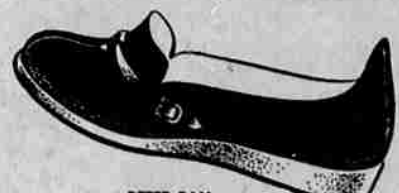
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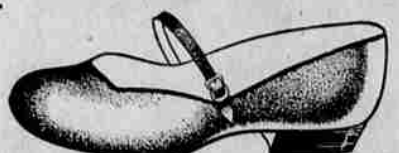


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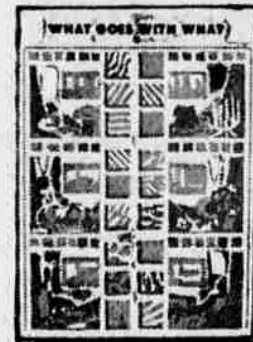
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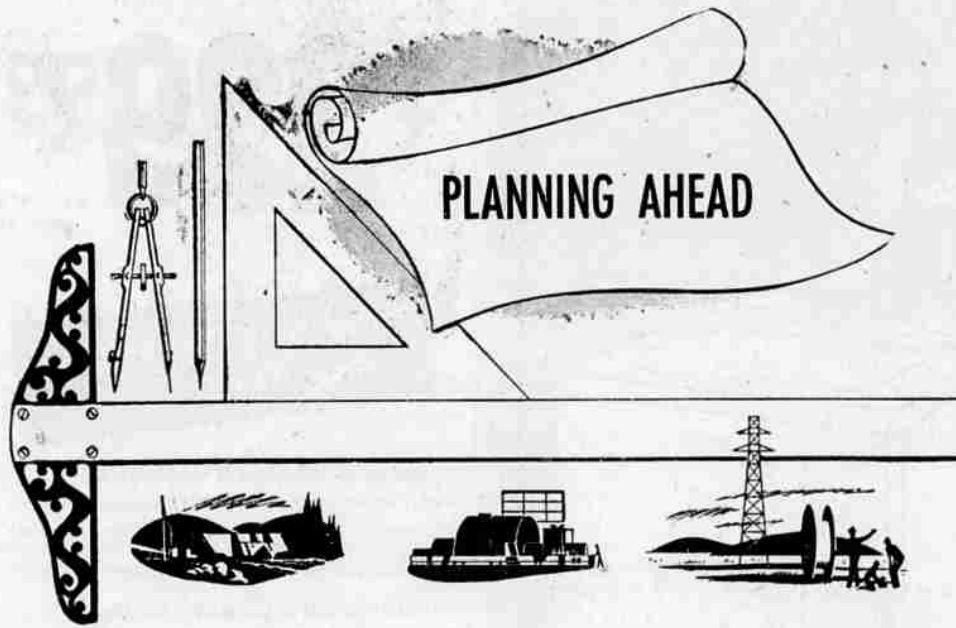


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
