French Actor Influenced By Paris, Hollywood Visit

HOLLYWOOD — Jacques Bergerac, a handsome Basque from Biarritz, has had two awakenings in his young life. One came at 17 when he saw Paris for the first time. The second was at 26 when he visited Hollywood.
 Both events have had a profound influence on his life. He told me about them as we lunched in a Sunset Strip cafe.
 "I had lived all my life in Biarritz, which is a very quiet town," he explained, "except for the two months of year when the international set make it their resort. Otherwise I had seen little of life."
 "I was just a boy when I went away to Paris for college. What an awakening! Such excitement! I acted in plays whenever I could. I graduated in law when I was 21 and left for my year in the Army."
 "When I returned to Paris, it was not to be a lawyer. I gave up the law to become an actor. I acted in many classic plays, like Moliere and Victor Hugo."
 Bergerac traveled with the crowd. One night he went to a party at the Leik Bank place of a

married in Palm Springs. At the end of his first year here, he made an extensive screen test with Jane Powell. The bosses felt he needed a year's more seasoning with the English language. He quit to be a free-lancer. His first movie was made in England, and he co-starred with Ginger. "I didn't want it that way," he said. "But the script was good and called for me to play a Frenchman, which I am. So I did it. But both of us hope we can go our own ways professionally."

Nationalists Hit Red Mainland

TAIPEH, Formosa (P)—Nationalist China's air force and navy today bombarded the Red-held mainland opposite Formosa for the 17th straight day; the Defense Ministry announced.
 A special communique said three Communist water ghosts—frogmen—attempted to land on the north coast of Quemoy but were driven off by an alert sentry. The water ghosts presumably were after prisoners.
 Quemoy, about seven miles off the big Red base of Amoy, has been the center of a "vest pocket war" between the Communists and Nationalists since Sept. 3 when Red guns on the mainland shelled the island outpost for hours.

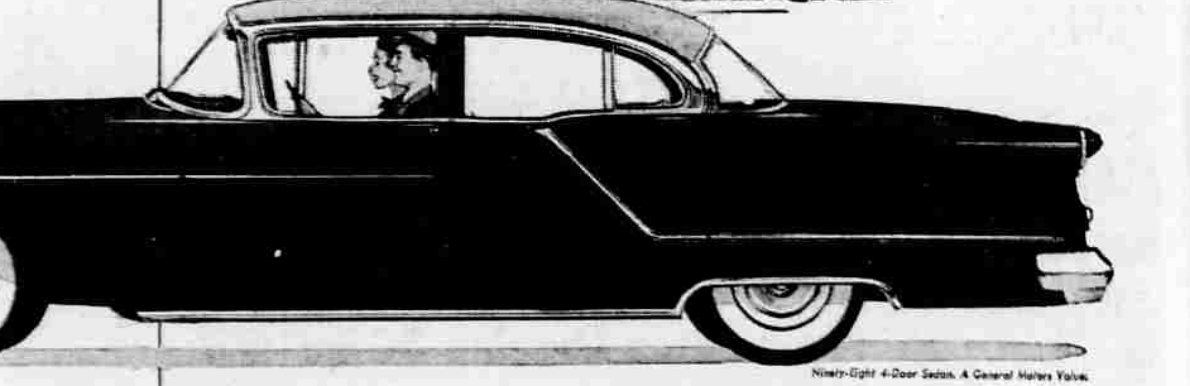
FIRE ON STOCKHOLM, Sweden
