STOCKS

WALL STREET
NEW YORK (AP)—Selected industrial stocks moved upward Tuesday in moderately active trading. But several important sectors lagged.

Oils, motors, chemicals, airlines and radio-television stocks developed demand in late afternoon dealings. But steel, aircrafts and copper mining issues were generally lower. Railroads, utilities and mail order stocks were irregular.

Lightship Weathers Bad Storm

BOSTON (AP)—Another chapter of danger and drama was logged into the 100-year history of Nantucket lightships Tuesday as crew members told of a 2 1/2 hour battle last Saturday with hurricane seas.

The 95-ton floating lighthouse, her bow plates smashed, her rudder gone and her bridge almost demolished, groped into port under way Monday night. Aboard was her 12-man crew, who could have abandoned ship—even if they wanted to.

Chief Boatwain's Mate John C. Corea of Provincetown, skipper of the 149-foot craft told the story of "2 1/2 hours of hell" after his ship was slammed by a 70-foot wave and 110 mile an hour winds 40 miles southeast of Nantucket Island right in the teeth of hurricane Edna.

Radioman James E. Sheahan of Framingham, painfully burned when his radio erupted sparks, frantically sent out an SOS.

Any acknowledgment of the distress signal was lost in the mountainous seas that again swept the vessel.

Fire broke out throughout the ship as tons of foam crashed through a jagged hole in the bow. The fire horn was silenced. Then the electrical system failed.

Below deck in the darkness the Nantucket's "black gang" struggled to push back the ocean and get up steam in the craft's soaked engines.

Three seamen including Lynn R. Clapp of Warrenton, Ore., raced to plug holes in the port bow and then managed to drop an emergency anchor.

For 2 1/2 hours the Nantucket floundered. After its first distress signal Sheahan was able to get off only one other message.

It said: "We're taking a helluva beating."

Neuberger Urges Debate

BEND (AP)—Richard L. Neuberger, Democratic candidate for the U. S. Senate, said here Monday night that the Republican incumbent, Guy Cordon, should meet him in debate "in every city and town of Oregon."

Previously Neuberger had said he had accepted nearly a dozen invitations to appear on the same platform as Cordon before various groups and that Cordon had declined each invitation.

Neuberger said here in his prepared remarks that "I do not favor an isolated debate, held in the antisocial atmosphere of a Portland broadcasting studio. It should be a series of daily debates in practically all the communities of Oregon—debates in the grand old tradition of Abe Lincoln and Stephen Douglas."

His reference to a Portland studio debate may have been occasioned by the famous meeting of Gov. Thomas E. Dewey and Harold Stassen here in the Republican primary election campaign of 1944.

Cordon, meanwhile, was preparing what is generally regarded as his major first speech to be given at The Dalles Wednesday night. A score of radio stations as well as three TV stations will carry the speech—some of them by recording at later dates.

KF Residents Hear Benson

Mrs. Olive Cornett, National Republican committeewoman from Oregon, Henry Benson, state representative and Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hurd, Klamath Falls, have returned from Salem where they heard Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson speak at the Oregon State Fair.

His listeners were deeply impressed with the sincere interest in the agricultural progress and problems of the West, Mrs. Cornett said.

He assured Oregon and Washington wheat growers that they are not included in his policy on reduction of wheat acreages in accordance with elimination of high fixed support prices in favor of his flexible support program.

There has been little expansion of wheat acreages in the western section of the country as a result of the wartime incentive to production and the secretary favored wheat growing in these areas.

He also promised quick compliance with the request made by Governor Paul Patterson of Oregon, for cooperation from the departments of the interior and agriculture on speeding timber sales in winter - workable areas of national forests.
