During the revolution it was snatched out of Russia and eventually was purchased by Mr. Rubini.

## Blood Donor Policy Told

A new policy in accepting blood donors who have had jaundice or malaria has been announced by the Portland Regional Blood Center of the Red Cross through the local Red Cross office.

The change now makes it possible for many persons to donate who have previously been rejected because of medical history. Donors who have had a medical history of malaria, but have not had a clinical attack of the disease the preceding two years, may now be accepted for donation to be used as whole blood. Persons with a history of infectious or homologous serum hepatitis, or jaundice may be accepted as donors of blood that is to be used for plasma fractionation only.

These changes in medical criteria are the result of recent studies in the blood program, and will make it possible for many to donate who have not previously been acceptable.

The bloodmobile visit sponsored by the United Veterans is planned for September 22-23 at the armory. Hours on Wednesday are from 4 to 8 and on Thursday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and 6 to 8 p.m.
