

KUHS To Start Broadcasts

With prep school sports in full swing, the Script and Microphone Guild of Klamath Union High School launches its new series of the Klamath Sports Album Wednesday at 9:30 p.m. on Station KFUL.

Handling the sportscasting assignment this year is Jim Dutcher, KUHS senior, with Bob Dixon as script writer. Jackie Arkenman and JoAnne Bellinger will again present the "Portrait of a Pelican," a regular feature which nets prize winners two free tickets every week to any Pelican home sports event.

A special interview with John Glubrecht, plans superintendent of Klamath Falls public schools, is one of the highlights of Wednesday's opening show.

Produced by Chuck Woodhouse as a project of advanced radio speaking students, the Album is written and presented entirely by KUHS students.

U.S. Grain Report Given

Klamath Basin farmers, about half way through the grain harvest and the second cutting of hay aren't the only ones having trouble with the weather, according to the Weekly Grain Market Review issued September 10, by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Grain crops are poor throughout most of the Northern Hemisphere, the review says. Only a tenth of England's grain was harvested by September 1. Chances of salvaging the remainder of the crop were poor, as England winds up one of her wettest summers in years.

East Germany reports the poorest harvest since the war. Austria is importing feed corn for her cattle. Red China lost most of her rice crop under a late larger than Texas. Rains there were the heaviest in 100 years.

Closer to home Pacific Northwest wheat growers were still being hampered by wet weather. Much of the wheat currently being harvested is above the acceptable 14 per cent moisture level. Storage houses were reluctant to handle this high-moisture grain, and bought it only on severe discounts.

Wet weather in the late wheat districts of Canada, Minnesota and the Dakotas was also delaying harvests there. Further rust damage was feared as well as possible frost damage.

As harvesting continues in the Pacific Northwest following the recent rainy period, more discolored, high moisture and stained barley were represented in daily arrivals. This resulted in market pressure as a portion was too badly deteriorated to be eligible for support. No market discounts had yet been established on this quality grain. Demand for good maling grades was fair, the weekly review concluded.

Square Dance Caller Stated

Fenton G. (Jonesy) Jones, nationally known square dance caller, will appear at the Do-Si-Do clubroom at the airport Wednesday, September 29 at 1 p.m., where he will call the squares for an open dance.

This is Jonesy's second appearance in Klamath Falls, although he is a frequent guest caller in Medford and Grants Pass.

A native of California, he started his career 15 years ago as a hillbilly singer and guitar player over Los Angeles radio stations and in 1940 began calling square dances professionally.

He has appeared in five movies and has recorded dance albums for several recording companies. His records on square dancing are considered tops by callers of the Klamath Basin.

Jonesy considers square dancing the best social activity for people of all ages.

Orchard Heat Survey Held

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — Fruit and vegetables growers in Oregon may be saved losses from frost damages as a result of an orchard heating study using sawmill residues now underway at the Oregon Forest Products Laboratory.

Stanley E. Gorder, engineer in charge of the investigation, reported a \$5,000,000 loss was caused this year by frost damage to orchards in the Rogue River Valley alone. The Willamette and Hood River valleys are also frost damage areas.

Oil heaters — smudge pots — are used now for frost protection. The fuel is expensive and the heavy smoke produced in use is highly objectionable.

In some areas, large volumes of sawmill residues are available for use as fuel. Means for storing and transporting this fuel development of satisfactory burning methods of using wood residues to prevent frost damage.
