## Sensational Singer Saves Career By Quick Thinking

**HOLLYWOOD** — How to conquer adversity in one quick lesson.

The conqueror is Harry Belafonte, the sensational young singer. He saved his career in one evening.

It happened a couple of years ago in Las Vegas. Harry had made a small hit in a couple of chic night spots in New York with his singing of folk songs. Very high brow stuff. So some smart character booked him into Vegas, not realizing the difference between the smart Manhattan audiences and the pleasure seekers of the Nevada apas.

"I played the first show of the evening, and it was horrible," recalled Harry. "I don't mean they just didn't like my act; they were abusive. The orchestra members started snickering among themselves. The 'dese and dem' guys started to get threatening. I'm sure that if stoning had not been punishable by law, I would have gotten it from the audience.

"I got mad. I didn't mind if they didn't like my act. That was their privilege. But I thought it was wrong for them to be hurling such abuse at me.

"I decided to salvage what I could. I had opened the show with a couple of old English folk songs. Naturally they fell flat. So I told my accompanist, Mildred Thomas, to bring out some of the arrangements we had been saving.

"We juggled the act completely. The reaction was entirely different from the first song. The audience was enthusiastic, and we were the talk of the Las Vegas strip."

From then on, Harry was in. He played one of the leading roles in MGM's "Bright Road." He starred on Broadway in "John Murray Anderson's Almanac" and came back to Hollywood to play the lead in "Carmen Jones." He is embarking on a night club tour, having just closed at the Coconut Grove here.

## Vets Reminded Of Benefits

With the fall term of school approaching, World War II and Korean veterans were reminded this week of their possible entitlement to state of Oregon educational benefits while attending college or other accredited schools.

Raymond E. Petley, educational officer for the State Department of Veterans' Affairs, said students should establish eligibility and file their application forms immediately with his office in order to avoid loss of the benefits. Applications by mail should go to the Salem office in the State Library Building. They may be filed in person at either the Salem or Portland offices, or through county veterans' service officers. The necessary forms also are available at most schools.

State aid pays the veteran \$50 a month while enrolled in a full time, undergraduate college course, or \$35 a month for any other accredited course requiring 40 classroom hours of attendance monthly. Attendance of less than 40 hours pays at the rate of \$7 1/2 cents per classroom hour.

To qualify, the veteran must have been an Oregon resident for one year or more prior to his

to a maximum of 36 months. State aid is not payable at the same time the veteran is receiving federal GI educational benefits, nor is it payable for correspondence or hobby courses. There is no deadline, either for World War II or Korean veterans.

**State Beer Sale Shows Decrease**  
**PORTLAND** — Beer sales dropped 17.7 per cent in Oregon in the fiscal year ended June 30, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission reported Thursday.

That was three million gallons under the previous year's total. Sales of wine and liquor meanwhile went up 1.82 per cent. The totals were 24,190,579 gallons of beer, 1,077,931 gallons of wine, and 201,786 gallons of liquor.
