Formal Reopening For New Oregon Food Store Slated

Newest addition to rapidly growing Suburban South Sixth Street, is the enlarged Oregon Food Store, No. 3, to be formally opened in the near future. The entire store is now open for business. The \$50,000 new addition has a floor space of 48 by 120. Exterior is of concrete faced with Roman split tile and redwood trim. The entire front of the building is glass, including the remodeled grocery departments. The new addition has a spacious mezzanine which is devoted to complete stocks of women's and children's ready to wear, an infants section and a layette gift shop. Housewares, hardware, electrical appliances, toys, men's and boy's clothing, yardage, notions, home remedies, magazines and greeting cards, stationery and gift items are on the main floor. All departments are completely self service to conform with the grocery department. Department heads will assist with purchases which are taken to a central checking station at the front of the store. New features in the grocery store include a frozen meat service where customers may choose frozen cuts for locker storage, more lines of frozen foods, larger produce and self service specialties and a "party pantry" specializing in fancy food items have been added. Increased parking facilities have been provided to accommodate nearly double the original number of cars that could be handled. Joe Fales is owner of the three Oregon Food stores, the remodeled unit at 4480 South Sixth, one at 2419 South Sixth Street and the third at 1350 Oregon Avenue. Store No. 3 was built in 1950. Mrs. Paul (Nellie) Angstead is general manager of the three stores. Mrs. Annes M. Goodwin, formerly of Miller's is in charge of the children's and women's ready to wear. Other personnel in the new

section are Mrs. Mary Long, Mrs. Marylou Rous, Avadna Paxton, Mrs. May Smith, Mrs. Ada Barlen, Mrs. Bessie Truax, Mrs. Arla Jack, Paul Harms. Bob King is assistant manager of the grocery department, Morgan Johnson is meat department supervisor, George Gates is in charge of produce and Ruth Warren is office manager. Work was started last June. Thomas K. Harper, Klamath Falls is the contractor.

Farm Youth Program Told

A chance to live with a farm family in another country is being offered to young Oregon people with a farm background.

Applications for International Farm Youth Exchange delegates are being taken by the state 4-H Club office at Oregon State College until October 1.

Next summer's visitors abroad will be selected from these applications.

Winnifred K. Gillen, state 4-H Club agent, lists these requirements for applicants:

They must be between 20 and 30, unmarried, and high school graduates. They also are required to have been reared on a farm and know its life and work, have a future personality, and be eager to understand people.

Not only do American farm youths visit other countries, but those nations that cooperate in the program send their young people to live with families in the United States for short periods.
