Lower Freight Rates Told

Action has been taken by Acme Fast Freight, Inc., to reduce freight rates being paid by Klamath Falls merchants and shippers, according to Newton J. Mundlin, general agent for Acme Fast Freight, here.
 Reduction is expected to amount to 21 cents per hundredweight in some classifications, up to \$2.19 in others, depending upon the type of commodity and the rate it now carries.
 His announcement, made this week, states:
 "We have realized for a long time the problem confronting local shippers in having to pay higher freight charges than firms in key terminals; however, because of cost factors and rate structures of the forwarders, we have not been able to eliminate the arbitrary."
 "Now, in view of the changes in our basic rate structures which became effective with Modified Rule 10, we immediately started checking to see whether or not we could eliminate the arbitrary and we are happy to say that Acme Fast Freight has taken definite

action to correct its tariffs, eliminating the arbitrariness to Klamath Falls.
 "We cannot right now give the effective date, but it usually takes more than 30 days before the ICC will make a supplement effective, so it should become effective about November 1."
 Mundlin emphasized that Acme Fast Freight is acting independently of other public carriers in this application pending before the ICC.
