Keynote talk, "Christian Youth as Leaders in Today's World," James Mummary, associate executive secretary of the Pacific Northwest Area Council of YMCAs; announcement of workshops by Paul Deller, institute chairman. Workshops begin at 11:30 a.m. on the general theme, "Hi-Y, Tri-Hi-Y fundamentals which will help develop Christian leadership for working together."
