Wheeler and a passenger, Clarence Booker, also of Kirk, were shaken up but not hospitalized. Both cars were badly wrecked.

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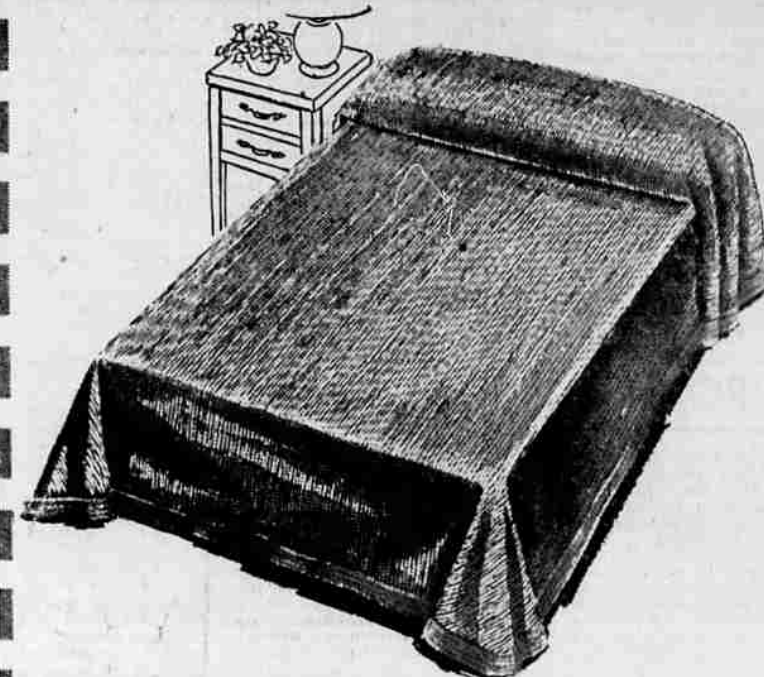
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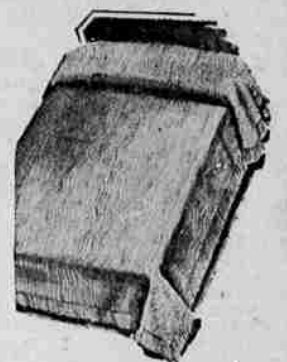
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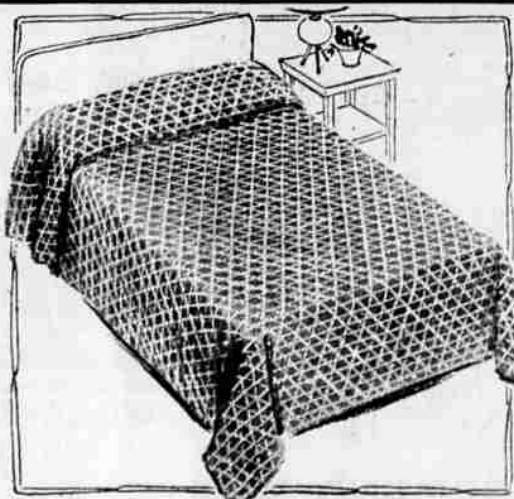


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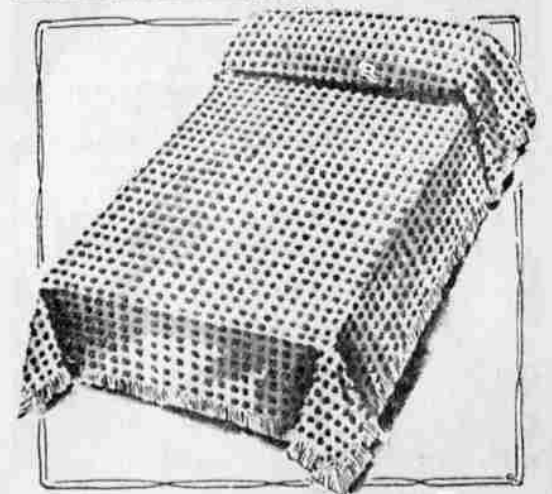
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
