British Labor Party Meets To Discuss Germany, China

SCARBOROUGH, England (AP) — Britain's opposition Labor party opened its annual conference today on a note of united friendliness toward Communist China. But the show of unity was a prelude to serious divisions certain to break into the open later over the issue of rearming Germany.

The main business at today's opening session was a discussion of the recent visit to the Soviet Union and Red China by the party's moderate chief, former Prime Minister Clement Attlee, his bitter rival, leftwinger Aneurin Bevan, and six other party leaders.

Attlee set the tone for the party's approach on Red China at a rally here last night at which he called for immediate admission of the Peiping regime to the United Nations.

The West, he declared, must seek ways of coexisting with the Communist world, for the only alternative "to coexistence is 'death' in a third world war."

Because it links peoples of both the East and West, the British Commonwealth has the unique duty of trying to find the road to peaceful coexistence with the Reds, Attlee continued. His delegation's visit to the Reds, he said, was an effort to establish contacts with the 600 million people of China and the 200 millions of the Soviet Union.

Indicative of the party's general approval of this approach to the Reds were the cheers at last night's rally when Dr. Edith Summerskill, only woman member of the touring group, announced she had invited Soviet Premier Georgi Malenkov and Chinese Premier Chou En-lai to visit Britain.

The big fight between Attlee's moderates and Bevan's radicals shaped up for the conference session tomorrow, when rival resolutions on the proposed rearmament of West Germany will be debated. The party's national executive committee, dominated by the Attlee group, has submitted a carefully worded resolution to continue the party's support of German rearmament with safeguards.

The Bevanites lumped more than two dozen opposing proposals into one resolution to "condemn all proposals of German rearmament."

The recent upsurge of anti-rearmament sentiment in the Trades Union Congress made the outcome

doubtful. The TUC, which supplies five million of the Labor party's six million members, is usually the chief support of the moderates, while Bevan is backed by most of the one million members in the constituency—or "grass roots"—section.

At their annual conference two weeks ago the unionists approved continued efforts toward German rearmament by the narrow margin of 4,077,000-3,622,000.

Should the voting in the party congress reflect this division, it could mean a reversal in the party's present endorsement of the Churchill government pro-rearmament policy. Such an end to the bipartisan backing of the program in Britain would come just as Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden and other Western leaders are trying to negotiate a rearmament agreement at the London nine-power conference opening tomorrow.

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Eisenhower Entertains Big Crowd With Beef Stew Feed

DENVER (AP) — President Eisenhower, playing the role of supervising chef, invited more than 175 guests to a beef stew lunch today.

The guests included several long-time friends who have been Eisenhower neighbors the many years he has been spending Colorado vacations at the home here of his mother-in-law, Mrs. John S. Doud.

Invited, too, were quite a few Denver business men who are golfing pals of the President. Also asked were a couple of fellows who make a living at golf and give Eisenhower a few pointers — Ed Dudley, the pro at the Augusta National Club in Georgia and at Colorado Springs, and Ralph.

(Rip) Arnold, pro at Denver's Cherry Hills club where today's luncheon was being held.

The President also invited about 40 newsmen who have been covering his activities here. He said they were to have a half holiday today and gave instructions that everything at the luncheon, except the beef stew recipe and guest list, was off the record.

Close friends of Eisenhower have been telling for years about his beef stew, a ritual-like preparation usually several days in the making.

The recipe the White House made public is for 60 people, but assistant White House press secretary Murray Snyder told apprehensive newsmen enough stew was being cooked to provide even "seconds" for the more than 75 guests.

Here's the recipe:
First off you get 20 pounds of prime round steak — something

considerably better than the "stewing meat," the White House calls it. Also eight pounds of small Irish potatoes, six bunches of small carrots, five pounds of small onions, 15 fresh tomatoes, three gallons of beef stock made from marrow bones with a bit of meat on it, salt, pepper, and a bunch of bouquet garniture, made of thyme, garlic and bay leaves.

With the ingredients ready, you start your beef stock two or three days ahead of your beef stew party. At Cherry Hills it has been simmering since Saturday.

Several hours in advance of the dinner hour put in the stew meat and cook it slowly in the beef stock until tender. Cook that mixture until the vegetables are done.

Then draw off two gallons of

beef stock and thicken it slightly with beef rue. In this case, the rue is a mixture of about a pint and half of the fatty substance on top of the beef stock, and about a pound of flour. The rue should simmer 10 to 15 minutes before being used to thicken the stew.

After it has simmered, pour it back into the stew. Then let the whole concoction simmer for an hour and a half and serve.

One other guest invited to today's luncheon was Secretary of Agriculture Benson, who told a meeting of the American Meat Institute and the United Fruit and Vegetable Association in New York the other day that the purpose of the Eisenhower beef stew lunch was to promote sales of meat and vegetables.

The President took it easy at the Doud home yesterday after he and Mrs. Eisenhower attended services at the Corona Presbyterian church.

Snyder reported the chief executive "quite happy" about what he

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termed "tremendously enthusiastic" reaction of GOP leaders to the stepped-up campaign Eisenhower waged in the Far West last week for election of another Republican congress.

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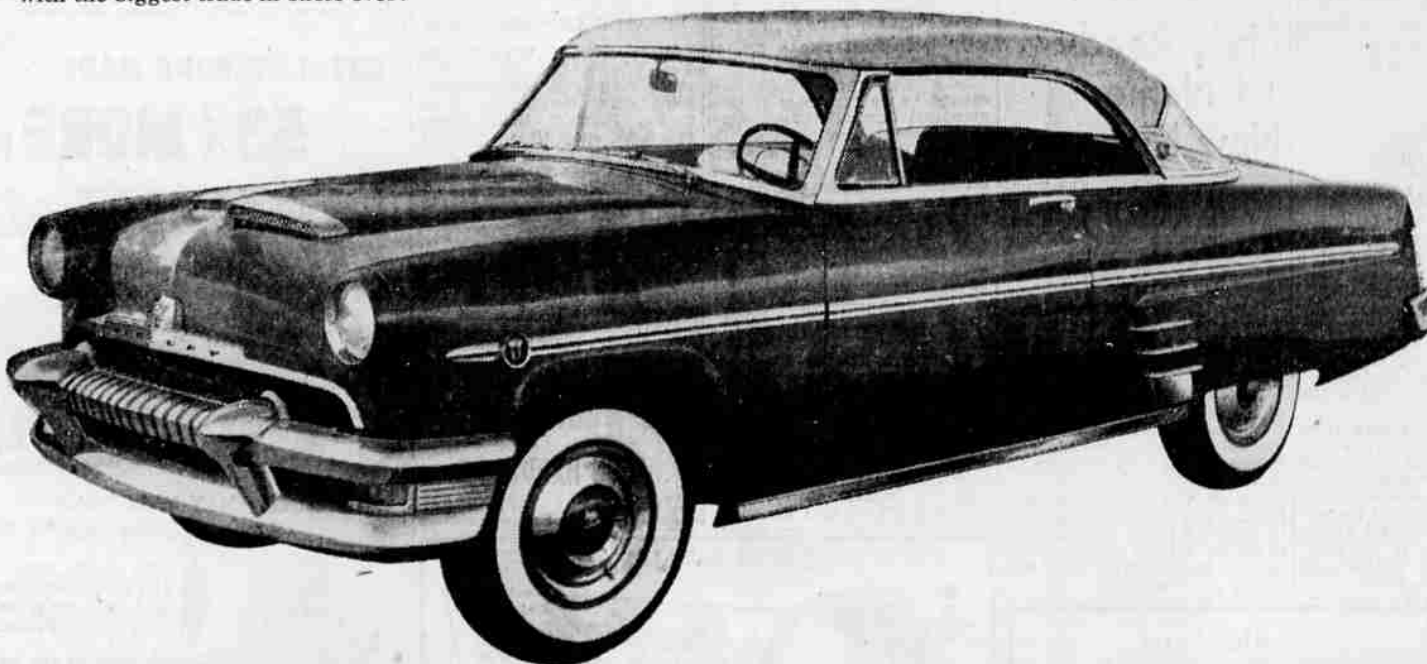
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
