Sports League Faces Suit

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Attorneys representing the bankrupt Liberty Broadcasting System planned Tuesday to file a \$2,100,000 anti-trust claim against the National Football League and nine of its clubs.

The proposed suit claims the pro loop unlawfully prevented radio broadcast of its games in the home territories of the NFL clubs.

NFL commissioner Bert Bell broke the news of the two-million-dollar damage action in a hurriedly-called press conference Monday in his suite of offices here.

The portly, gravel-voiced commissioner made this only comment as he tossed the bill of complaint on the table:

"These two attorneys from Dallas, Texas, walked into my office, handed me this legal paper and started to talk about making a settlement, and I said 'we settle with no one.'"

William Burrows and Hawkins Golden explained afterwards: "We never start a fight by hitting a man in the back. We tell him that there's a fight coming and that's what we did here. They were offered peace or war."

"The court instructed us that if the matter could be composed amicably it should be done."

Burrows said his reference to "the court" concerned the federal appointee trustee of the bankrupt Liberty firm and D. M. Oldham of Dallas, federal referee in bankruptcy, who is acting for creditors owed about \$900,000.

Besides the NFL, the suit names the Chicago Bears, Chicago Cardinals, Cleveland Browns, Detroit Lions, Green Bay Packers, New York Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, Pittsburgh Steelers and Washington Redskins.

Brooks-Scanlon Strike Ended
