Kent Larson, co-owner and manager of the Modoc Title Company in Alturas, was appointed by city council members to fill the vacancy left by Rex Riley. Riley resigned from the council to assume his new duties as regional coordinator for civilian defense, with offices at Redding. The council is now composed of Jim Reid, mayor, Jim Maher, Harry Plimco, Neal Phillips and Kent Larson.

Frank Corrigan, 62, Oakland, was killed instantly when the car he was driving failed to negotiate the Canby Y, and rolled over. Corrigan was thrown clear of the car.

A sedan stolen at Tulelake sometime after 10 p.m. Tuesday, has been recovered. The automobile belonging to Vern Hemstreet, Tulelake, went through the quarantine station at 4:45 yesterday afternoon and disappeared from sight. It was found last night abandoned behind a housing project in Canby. And several hours later a 1953 GMC pickup belonging to Paye Harrington, Alturas, was stolen. The pickup, an off white color, bears license No. A-99-999.

Other Modoc County reservations and rancherias discussed by the committee were the Lookout Forty, the Old Likely Reservation, and the Alturas Indian settlement. The hearings are being held to determine what course the state of California will follow in the event the Federal Indian Bureau is abolished and California Indians are granted deeds to the property they now occupy.

The population of Alturas was increased by one, when a baby boy arrived at 12:16 for the Edward Schneegas of Alturas. The little one weighed 6 pounds, 9 ounces. Schneegas is employed by the Forest Service.

Funeral services for Arthur Blavans, 71, who passed away at his

home in Likely Sunday, will be held at 2:00 Wednesday at the Kerr Chapel. Interment will be at Likely. Mr. Blavans was born August 1, 1883 in Missouri and came to Modoc about 32 years ago. He is survived by his son Allen in Alturas; three brothers, John in Kansas, George in Nebraska, and Cecil in Likely. Two sisters, Mrs. Ollie McAdams in Kansas and Mrs. John McGarva in Likely. There is one grandson, Dean Blavens and several nieces and nephews.

and Lester Boggs. Mrs. Cline spends each winter here with Mrs. Horn and Jack.

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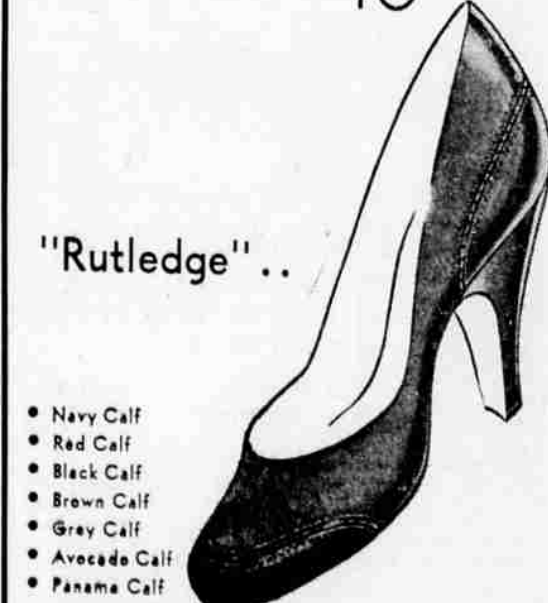
