



Beauty Tips By Max Factor

This fall's magnificent tweeds, slubbed or nubbed, bright or somber, hairy or smooth, color-flecked or unflecked, will highlight any irregularities, especially sallowness, of a woman's skin, according to Max Factor Jr., a tweed-wearer himself. Therefore, he claims, the make-up must go all out to make the skin look feminine and finished.

He advises wearing a tinted make-up foundation. Choose and use it for evening skin color and glow, not for the thickness of its coating. To veil any or all little flaws, bring skin tones from hairline to an After-Five neckline into one uniform tone. To impart an impeccable finish, all you need to use of it is a film as sheer as chiffon, says Factor.

In foundation shades, avoid those that are too brown, too beige or too drab. Factor's thumbs are also down on too-pink shades.

"Wear rouge," says Factor. Here he adds, is one of the most feminine aids a woman can use to cope with the dull texture of neutral coloring of tweeds. Highlight make-up with "hot - tempered" shades of lipstick, he adds.

SLIM ANKLES

Max Factor says that long-stemmed American beauty is sometimes more art than nature. What's more, he adds, a trick of darkening ankles with rouge or dark powder is better than two years of exercise for shaping legs more to your liking. Apply dark rouge up the back of the leg from

heel to ankle. Apply in like manner up the sides of the ankle; now blend, fading coloring out a bit beyond the ankle area. Cover this subtle tinge with sheer, dark hose, the darker the better.

While dressing up legs to make ankles look fragile enough to snap, here are some tricks of the trade you don't want to overlook, says Factor. He claims that much of Hollywood's leg art depends upon tricks like these:

1. Wear stockings with tapered heels.
2. The more neutral the stocking shade — neither too ruddy a tan nor too ashen a gray — the slimmer your legs will look.
3. The more ankles need slimming, the more they need hosiery's

cobweb sheerness; the tribute of tiny seams, superb fashioning, narrower and silkier heel reinforcement — in a word, the finest flatery.

4. The duller these silken snares, the better they'll minimize leg flaws.

5. Whatever kind of stockings are worn, keep them lightly tattered. The straighter the stocking seams, the better-groomed your legs will look.
