## Lake Project Said Success

Fish populations in Diamond Lake are a thing of the past, for the present at least! On September 21, the climax of many years struggle to control scrap fish populations in the lake was reached. Hence, the largest lake rehabilitation project in history was carried out at a cost of approximately \$150,000.

A working force of nearly 250 game commission men and sportsmen saturated the lake with 200,000 pounds of the fish killing chemical, rotenone. Blessed with good weather conditions, the crews started at dawn and most of the chemical application had been completed by noon; however, mopping up operations continued until the next day.

Final "coup de grace" is to be executed by a spray plane covering the swampy areas at the south end of the lake. These areas have already been treated twice on foot. John Dimick, game commission biologist who directed the big operation, stated, "The treatment was a complete success, and in my opinion, there is no possibility that any fish escaped." He continued, "Few trout were killed simply because there were few trout in the lake. Any that may have left the lake during drainage have provided angling elsewhere."

Three days following the treatment, reports disclosed that roach were piling up in windrows along the beaches. Where dead fish could be observed on the bottom, no game fish could be noted among the thousands of undesirable roach.

Several rumors circulated before and after the treatment had no foundation in fact. The lake was not stocked this year, and the lake was not sealed earlier this year to.

## Portland CofC Cancels Talks

Cancellation of the Foreign Policy Conference scheduled to be held in Portland October 3 and 6 was announced Tuesday morning by R. L. Clark, president, Portland Chamber of Commerce. Principal reason, said Clark, was the withdrawal of several top government speakers who have been forced to cancel their participation because of the heavy commitments on their time in Washington, D. C.

Walter Bedell Smith, undersecretary of state, slated to address the evening, October 6, was one of the first major cancellations. Since then, said Clark, there have been several others, including Thomas P. Pike, assistant secretary of defense.

## Wyoming Sends Golden Trout

A shipment of gold has arrived in Oregon this month, thanks to Wyoming. Golden trout fry, 12,500 in via pickup truck on September 17. Dr. J. H. Rayner, chief of the fisheries division of the Oregon State Game Commission, advised that through the courtesy of the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission we received these trout from one of their hatcheries at Daniel, Wyoming.

The small goldens will be released in a number of the high lakes in Walla Walla County. Goldens have already been introduced into some of the high elevation waters in northeastern Oregon. It is expected that they will find congenial surroundings to their liking than have some of the other species formerly introduced in that area.
