

Nixon Confident Of Easy GOP Win In November, But No Letup In Campaign Seen

Vice President Nixon says the Republicans will win the Nov. 2 election "going away" and National Chairman Leonard Hall, now sees the GOP "firmly on the high road."

Brazil Vote Tally Opens

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP)—A count of the 12 million votes cast in Sunday's orderly congressional elections started throughout Brazil Monday but full returns were not expected for about two weeks.

The balloting will determine the support of President Joao Café Filho's six-week-old conservative government.

Reliable reports said his ministers plan to resign if opposition forces win a pronounced victory and tie up the new congress. The full Chamber of Deputies—326 seats—and two-thirds of the Senate—41 seats—are involved in the contest.

Balloting also was for the governors of 11 of Brazil's 20 states and many municipal officials. Lines were drawn in the heated campaign between Café's Center and rightist followers and leftists under the banner of the late President Getulio Vargas. The "Legacy of Death"—the suicide note he left when he shot himself last Aug. 23—was a key factor in the contest.

Vote tabulations started Monday, there was no indication of which way the electorate would turn.

Young GOP OK's United Nations

PENDELTON (AP)—The Young Republican Federation of Oregon, which ended a two-day convention here Sunday, approved a resolution advocating permanent U.S. membership in the United Nations.

S. Eugene Allen, Republican candidate for state labor commissioner, was principal speaker. Other resolutions:

Condemned "the confusing of the power issues by chattering extremists," and said that local groups should get a chance to build and operate multi-purpose dams.

Urged continued high priority in the United States for development of atomic weapons.

CHERBOURG, France (AP)—Japanese Premier Shigeru Yoshida arrived in Cherbourg Monday aboard the liner Queen Elizabeth for an official visit to France.

Recent weeks that the Republicans must "run scared" to retain control of Congress.

However, neither Nixon nor Hall, in their latest statements, signalled any letup in the GOP campaign. And another top Republican—House Leader Charles A. Halleck—called for even greater efforts.

Halleck told newsmen in Denver Sunday that he hopes President Eisenhower will schedule more fighting campaign talks to give the Republican cause a boost. "After talking politics with the President, Halleck said the GOP is in 'a tough fight'."

Nixon, at a Lexington, Ky., reception marking the start of his third major campaign tour, said Sunday night:

"We're going to win in the stretch and win going away. We have a President who is popular and a program that is good."

Hall, in a statement released in Washington, said the Republicans are "firmly on the high road to win next month."

The principal Democratic campaign volley fired off during the weekend came from Adlai Stevenson, the party's 1952 presidential candidate.

Addressing a Democratic rally in Detroit Saturday, Stevenson said "the most disturbing aspect of the GOP economic record in these past months is not just that we have slipped backward but failure to show genuine, human concern over it."

House Speaker Martin of Massachusetts Monday begins his second big campaign swing. He'll visit six Eastern and Midwestern states this week. Nixon's trip will take him to seven states.

The CIO's legislative department reported Sunday that in its view GOP members of Congress voted wrong and Democratic members voted right about three-fourths of the time in the last two years.

The report, based on voting on 29 "showdown" issues, said it will take "at least a few dozen re-placements in Congress next year to make sure that the damage that had been done will be repaired."

Hot Time Had In Church Ceremony

The counters had reached about 25 when the gunman returned seconds later and told them to "start over." They were close to 50 when the man fled with \$100.

Caldwell said he called police "while the others were still counting."

FREED

FRANKFURT, Germany (AP)—German newspapers reported Saturday that former Lt. Gen. Hermann Reinecke of the German high command has been freed from the U.S. war crimes prison at Landsberg where he was serving a life term.

Neither U.S. Army authorities nor State Department officials at Bonn would discuss the report. They recently put into effect a policy of official secrecy on release of war criminals.

Bureau Gives Milk Funds

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Agriculture Department Monday allotted 49 1/2 million dollars among the states and the District of Columbia to help boost the consumption of milk under the government-sponsored school lunch program.

The states in turn will pay schools for fluid milk consumed above last year's levels. Schools starting the sale of milk to children for the first time will get 3 cents for each half pint.

Schools which served milk last year will get 4 cents a half pint for all milk consumed above last year's level. The milk must be sold to pupils at net cost.

Congress authorized this program in an effort to get more milk consumed in fluid form and less diverted into the manufacture of surplus butter and cheese, which the government must buy under its dairy price support program.

The allotments by states included: Oregon \$435,526; Washington \$631,734.

KILLED

EUGENE (AP)—Margaret E. McClellan, 12, suffered fatal injuries Saturday when she was dragged along the ground with her foot caught in a stirrup after being thrown off a horse.

The accident occurred near her home at Veneta. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James H. McClellan.

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Drunken Youth Slashes Nurse To Death On Subway

NEW YORK (AP)—A youth, accused of stabbing a 70-year-old practical nurse to death in a subway train in Brooklyn, says he didn't know the woman and doesn't remember a thing about the slaying, police report.

"It was the most methodical, willful murder you can imagine," reported subway motorman John S. Hough.

Hough told police that husky, 19-year-old Everett D. Benson of Brooklyn, who had been drinking, and the murdered woman, Miss Minnie G. Williams, had been riding alone in the first car of the train.

The motorman said he looked out of his cab when he heard the woman scream twice just as the train pulled into the Clark Street station. The second cry, he said, was "a curdling yell with pain in it, and I knew something horrible was happening."

Hough said he saw Ben "just sitting there hacking her to pieces."

When the youth fled from the car, Hough chased him up to the street level, shouting "Murder! Police! Stop that man!"

Police said Benson collapsed on the sidewalk and Hough called a passing radio police car. The youth was taken to a hospital to sleep off the effects of alcohol, police said, and when he awoke, claimed:

"I don't remember anything from the time I got on the train at the President Street station until I woke up here."

He was charged with homicide.

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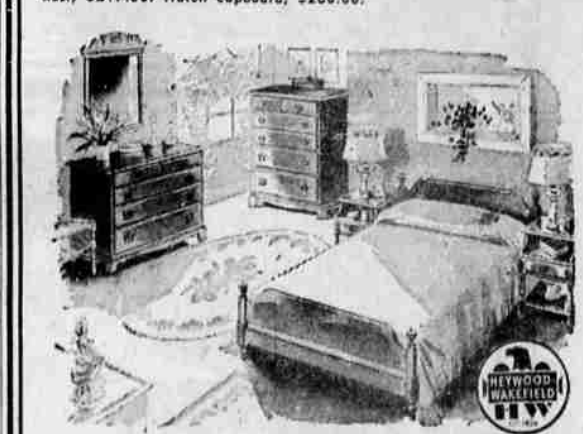
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
