Draft Test Dates Set

Oregon State Headquarters, Selective Service System, has announced the dates of the college qualification tests for the 1954-55 school year.

"The first test will be held Thursday, December 9, 1954, for which application cards must be mailed not later than midnight November 23, 1954," said Colonel Francis W. Mason, deputy state director, "and the second, and last one scheduled for this school year will be held Thursday, April 21, 1955, for which application cards must be postmarked not later than midnight March 7, 1955."

Colonel Mason went on to point out that application cards may be obtained from any selective service local board office.

"Registrants eligible to take this college qualification test are those who have completed or are just completing one year of college work. The Oregon State Headquarters urges all registrants who desire to complete their collegiate work to take this test. Where a passing score is obtained it provides one additional chance of remaining in school," continued Colonel Mason. "It must be remembered, however, that a passing score and the required class standing do not assure deferment but one of these criterion must be met before the local board can consider any registrant for college deferment."

Mitchum Fights Back As Critics Lash Out At Age

 HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Ever since Stanley Kramer cast Robert Mitchum as Lucas March in "Not as a Stranger," the producer has been getting comments in the mail like these:

"In heaven's name, please don't put that Mitchum person in 'Not as a Stranger.' The man should be young. Maybe Farley Granger could do it. If only you could get Montgomery Clift!"

"What in the name of heaven have the writers done to that sensitive part that a burly, crude lead such as Mitchum would even be considered?"

Mitchum's comment on the protests:

"They say I can't do the part. I say I can. That's what makes horse races."

Mitchum is ignoring the critics and pitching into the role. When I saw him, he and Frank Sinatra were among a group of medical students observing a major operation. Both men looked amazingly young. For Sinatra, this was accomplished by a deft hairpiece.

Mitchum's thinness aided the illusion of youth. He has been on a merry-go-round, doing two pictures at once and spending four or five hours many days at the hospital observing surgery.

Producer Kramer, who is directing for the first time in "Not as a Stranger," explained why he chose Mitchum despite the protests.

"I have talked to many surgeons since I started work on this picture over a year ago," he said. "I have found that most of them are big, rugged men. They are butchers, not in the derogatory sense but in the nature of the work they do. It takes a strong man to cut up human beings and to withstand the strain of hours over an operating table. That's why I picked strong personalities — Mitchum, Broderick Crawford, Charles Bickford — to play the surgeons in this picture."

"I may be wrong about Mitchum. Time will tell. But all I can say is that everybody said I was wrong about casting Van Johnson in 'The Caine Mutiny.' I don't hear them complaining now."

Cabby Foils Two Women Heisters

FULLERTON, Md. (AP) — Two women, one packing a pistol and the other a knife, were foiled in a hold-up attempt last night by a 35-year-old taxi cab driver.

Joseph Laderman told Baltimore County police that the women announced their holdup after a short ride from Baltimore City. Laderman slammed on his brakes, dumping his passengers on the floor.

Then he pulled the woman with the gun out of the vehicle and punched her in the eye.

Charlotte Davis, 26, and Margaret Davis, 28, both of Baltimore, were charged with armed robbery and carrying concealed weapons.

Minister Pays Off Patrons Car Fines

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Iowa (AP) — The Rev. J. T. Moriarty of St. Patrick's Church here paid off \$42 in traffic parking tickets for his parishioners.

During services Sunday, he told all car owners whose cars were ticketed while they were attending services to bring the tickets to him. There were 42 of them at \$1 each.

The cars were ticketed because they were parked on the wrong side of a street past the church on which parking is limited to one side only.

Mayor William Keenan said he will ask the City Council to strike out the limitation on the church street.

Solon Visits In Oregon

U.S. Senator Eva Bowring, Republican, Nebraska, is in Oregon this week visiting with state party members.

She is touring Wallowa County during the early part of the week with Mrs. Olive Cornett, Republican National Committeewoman from Oregon and Mrs. Margaret Von Lubken, state vice chairman in Oregon.

The three will join a caravan from Pendleton to Heppner, Condon, Arlington and The Dalles, Friday, October 8. At The Dalles, Mrs. Bowring will speak at a Republican dinner meeting, commemorating National Precedent Day.

Mrs. Bowring lives on the original family homestead owned by her late husband, Arthur Bowring, operating their Bar 99 cattle ranch of 10,000 acres. She has been identified with the GOP for many years and was appointed to the United States Senate to fill the vacancy created by the death of Dwight Palmer Griswold.

Lanza Proves Voice Okay

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Mario Lanza in a private concert to calm the critics has shown all his old vocal power and promised that all future TV appearances will be live.

"I may even stick my finger down my throat during a couple of numbers to let the public know that there are no recordings," the tenor added yesterday after singing arias from "Fagliacci" and the inevitable "Be My Love" for assembled newsmen and women.

Why were two-year-old recordings dubbed in on his TV debut last Thursday? Because of all those medical tests, said Lanza, while he was taking off 40 pounds in six weeks.

"They dehydrated me," he said. "They lowered my blood sugar. And my doctor said he would not be responsible for how I would react."

Princess Margaret To Tour Islands

LONDON (AP) — Princess Margaret will tour the Holiday Islands of the British West Indies.

An official announcement last night said the 24-year-old sister of Queen Elizabeth II would tour Trinidad, the Bahamas—150 miles off the Florida coast — Grenada, Barbados, Antigua and Jamaica in the royal yacht Britannia.

The announcement did not give the exact dates of the trip.
