



French To Push Probe Of Red Spy

PARIS (AP) — French police planned today to continue their questioning of Andre Baranes, a fellow-traveling newsmen who admitted passing French defense secrets to the Communists. Baranes has implied that high figures yet unnamed were involved in the growing spy scandal.

The central figure so far in the case which already has involved three top civil servants, Baranes described himself last night as only a "small fry."

Indicating that others were involved, he told Examining Magistrate M. J. Jean de Rosseguiere: "These are powerful people. Find them yourself."

The reporter for the left-wing newspaper Liberation told de Rosseguiere the information he passed along to Jacques Duclos, France's No. 2 Communist, only made the Red leader laugh.

"He laughed in my face and told me, 'We already have that,'" Baranes said.

"We are not the true authors of the leaks," he asserted.

As he left the hearing, Baranes called jauntily to photographers: "Take my picture tonight. I have a feeling soon you will have more important pictures to take."

The examining magistrate — whose function is similar to that of a U.S. grand jury — already has questioned some of France's top political figures, including former Premier Paul Reynaud. A summons has been served on Duclos and former Premier Joseph Laniel.

Boxcar Falls, Two Dead

FT. BRAGG, N.C. (AP) — A C119 Flying Boxcar crashed in flames here Wednesday and killed at least two men.

Heroic action by the pilot was credited by witnesses with saving the lives of a number of construction workers in the path of the falling plane.

The Army reported 14 casualties in the crash. There were 12 aboard the plane and two civilian two civilian workers on the ground were among the casualties. Public information officers said they did not know immediately whether the dead were military or civilian personnel.

(At Washington the Army said it had a report that four had been killed. But an Army source here said the Washington report was based on fragmentary information immediately after the crash.)

The big plane crashed in a barracks street at this sprawling military reservation shortly after a takeoff for Olinstead Air Force Base, Pa.

The Army and Air Force said it carried a crew of five and seven military passengers.

The plane, attached to the 464th Troop Carrier Wing at nearby Pope Air Force Base, had just taken off from Pope when its left engine caught fire.

Neuberger Blasts GOP in Oregon

Richard L. Neuberger, Portland Democrat who is trying to unseat Republican Sen. Guy Cordon, said Tuesday that "small businessmen are the forgotten souls of the Cordon-McKay regime in Oregon."

He told a business men's luncheon that federal court figures show a 50 per cent increase in Oregon bankruptcies for the fiscal year of 1954. He said the national average was a 23 per cent increase.

Neuberger said industrial payrolls have declined in Oregon and the state has lost out on expansion

of its aluminum industries because of policies favored by Cordon.

Sen. Wayne Morse, campaigning for Neuberger, told a rally in Albany Tuesday that Cordon is "misrepresenting the voting record which he claims entitles him to reelection."

He said Cordon claimed he had not voted for the Bricker amendment. "Cordon was co-sponsor of the Bricker amendment and supported Bricker's position on vote after vote . . .," Morse said.

He also accused Cordon of misrepresenting his stand on a federal dam at Hells Canyon. This was an attempt to avoid the unpopularity

of the administration's "walkout" in favor of Idaho Power Co.'s development plan, Morse said.

Joseph K. Garson, Democratic candidate for governor, told a Beaverton audience that he opposed a sales tax and he called on Gov. Patterson to make his views known on the issue.

Meantime, Howard Morgan, state Democratic chairman, announced

that Oscar Chapman, secretary of the Interior under the Democratic administration, would be principal speaker at the party's Jefferson-Jackson fund raising dinner at Portland Saturday.

State Sen. Robert D. Holmes of Astoria will be master of ceremonies.
