

## Johnson, Smith In Ring Meet

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Harold Johnson, bidding for his seventh shot at lightweight champion Archie Moore, and "Boardwalk Billy" Smith, seeking his fifth bout with the elderly champ, meet tonight for the first time in a 10-round fight at the arena.

Johnson, rated No. 1 contender for Moore's title, is quoted as a 14-5 favorite here in his home town. His last outing was in a championship scrap Aug. 11 when, with victory within his reach, he was knocked out by Moore.

That snapped a 12-bout winning streak for Johnson, whose record is now 48 wins and 6 defeats. Five of the defeats were at Moore's hands and the other was a knock-out loss to former heavyweight champion Jersey Joe Walcott.

Johnson will have the advantage of age—he's 26 and Smith is 33—speed and skill. Both boys have good punching power. Johnson has knocked out 22. And Smith has KO'd 30 in winning 56, losing 29 and fighting 4 draws. In four bouts with Moore, he lost three and drew one.

Smith is rated No. 4 in the light heavyweight division and is up-dated since coming East from Oakland, Calif., where he fought as Oakland Billy Smith.

Tonight's bout will be televised and broadcast by NBC at 10 p.m., EST.

## College Grid Briefs

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — Coach Len Casanova revised the Oregon lineup Thursday before the Ducks left for Berkeley and Saturday's Pacific Coast Conference football game with California.

Sophomore Johnny Keller was named quarterback to replace ailing George Shaw. Walt Gaffney was moved from right half to fullback and Lloyd Powell replaced Gaffney in the right half slot. Art Weber was picked as the center for Ron Pfeister and Ben-nous Cochran was given the left guard assignment.

Both Shaw and Pfeister are nursing injuries. Casanova said they may see limited action against the Golden Bears.

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) — Sophomore Ray Westfall will quarterback the Oregon State Beavers against Washington State at Pullman Saturday.

Coach Kip Taylor tagged Westfall for the assignment Thursday on the basis of his punting and passing in the game with Washington last week.

Taylor named another sophomore, Dan Naranche, to start at fullback. Tom Berry will start at right half and Taylor said either Dick Mason or Willie Kesloha will open at left half.

SEATTLE (AP) — Washington coach Johnny Cherberg will send a rookie-studded lineup against UCLA, the nation's No. 2 college football team, in the Pacific Coast Conference game here Saturday.

Bobby Cox, a sophomore, will handle the quarterbacking in place of injured Sandy Lederman, and four players with only limited varsity experience will be in the line. Veterans in front will be end Jim Houston and guards Earl Monlux and Larry Rhodes.

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — The Washington State backfield and line that started the game against Texas last week will be on the field at the kickoff in Saturday's football clash here with Oregon State, coach Al Kircher said Thursday.

The Cougars wound up their drills with practice on pass of fense and defense.

## Seixas, Trabert Carry U.S. Hopes

NEW YORK (AP) — The United States again will pin its hopes on Vic Seixas and Tony Trabert to take the Davis Cup back from Australia this year.

## Speedboat Championships Open Saturday

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — More than 100 boats already have arrived for the world outdoor speedboat championships, opening Saturday and continuing through Monday on Fort Loudoun Lake near here.

Scores of drivers are at work testing the one-mile oval course on the Tennessee Valley Authority Lake.

Officials of the National Outboard Assn., sponsoring the races, said they expect nearly 400 professional racing pilots from all 48 states and Canada for the races.

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## LA Coach Favors Extra Time

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Coach Hampton Pool of the Los Angeles Rams favors an extra three-week tryout for National Football League rookies who perform in the annual pro-college All-Star game.

Pool, taking time off while preparing the Rams for their important game with the Detroit Lions Sunday, was asked Thursday at a Rams boosters meeting what he thought of letting such rookies stay on a pro squad after the normal cutoff deadline.

"It's a good idea," said Pool. "Too often a rookie reporting back from the All-Star game doesn't have the time to show what he can do with the club which drafted him."

Pool cited two examples this year with his own club, ends Tom Scott of Virginia and Ed Beatty of Mississippi.

He said there was "no question these boys could have made our club" had they been allowed to stay with the Rams to make up for the time spent on the All-Star game at Chicago.

It was recalled that the Rams under the same circumstances almost lost their present star passing quarterback, Norm Van Brocklin, when he came out of the University of Oregon and played in the pro-college game. At the time the Rams had three fine quarterbacks, Bob Waterfield, Jim Hardy and Bobby Thomason.

## TIME OUT



LOS ANGELES (AP) — Texas Christian University hopes to ease Southern California out of its ninth position in the national ratings Friday night but the experts say the Trojans won't be budged.

Upward of 45,000 fans are expected to witness the intersectional football contest in Memorial Stadium, with the kickoff set for 8:30 p.m.

The Horned Frogs from the Southwest Conference have a squad heavily stocked with first and second year players. Operating from a split-T style of attack, the Frogs were good enough to defeat Kansas and throw a scare into Oklahoma and Arkansas in losing by close scores.

Southern Cal, unbeaten in three games but anything but impressive in victory over Northwestern last week, boasts a lot of speed and a better than fair passing game.

Potential threats for the Pacific Coast Conference title and the Rose Bowl, The Trojans employ a multi-gear attack—some straight T, single wing and even the split-T.

The Frogs, a spirited if comparatively green outfit, have averaged three touchdowns and almost 300 yards a game. USC has averaged about 26 points per game.

## Out Of Bears With The Sportsman

DEER HUNTERS and duck hunters alike are picking out spots to travel to this weekend as the fall outdoor season is beginning to get in full swing around the Klamath Basin.

The second weekend of deer season is upon us and despite the several hundred deer that were taken from the woods opening day and the few days to follow, more hunters will enter the timber for their try for a buck this Saturday and Sunday.

The rain that came to the area late this week will undoubtedly help the deer hunter in more ways than one, but most of all it will help KFFA and the other forest rangers in their plea for fire safety in the woods.

On opening day there were several fires reported and everyone of them, according to forestry officials, were started by careless hunters who built warming fires and left them burning in the tinder-dry woods, or by camp fires left burning when the campers left for their morning and evening hunts.

There have been some big deer brought in so far this year and another one or two big trophies are expected before the season is over, and from talking to several of the sporting good dealers, this season might be a better one than last as far as the number of deer taken and the average size of each animal.

In Ralph's Gun Shop's big buck contest, Bill Hilton leads with a

big 236 pound buck, while second place is held by Robert Hicks with a 216 pounder. The winner will receive a 30-06 equipped with scope that is valued at close to \$400.

In two other contests sponsored by local merchants James E. Savage (not the person of the same name affiliated with the federal game office here) leads the contest for the widest spread at the Gun Store with a rack measuring 38 1/2 inches. In Gun Store's other contest, one for the most points, Joe Lahota of Sprague River bagged a 15 point beauty that is the leader at this time.

Oregon Woolen Store sponsored a contest for the narrowest rack of horns and Johnny Moxingo is the leader at the time of this writing with a forked horn spread of 1 and 5-16 inches from one side to the other.

ON THE DUCK side of the picture, California opens the season on waterfowl tomorrow at noon, and the following Saturday at noon, Oregon joins in the fun.

The rain that will help the deer hunter along with the wind and fog that blanketed the Basin will undoubtedly lend a helping hand to the duck and goose hunter in Northern California.

Should his type of weather hang around for another week or so, then Oregon's opening should also be very good with plenty of shooting for everyone.

Hunting along the Cal-Ore line next to the game reserves between Tulare and Highway 97, should be very good as plenty of mallards and pin tail ducks have worked their way into the refuges, along with a good representation of Canadian Honkers and specks for those who prefer goose shooting.

GAME VIOLATORS never seem to learn except by the hard way or at least it is beginning to look that way. Federal and state officers have made nine arrests jointly since the opening of deer season and a few more are pending.

Illegal possession of untaged deer meat was the complaint against Lester Vernon Ramberg, 36, of Portland as officers found a ham of meat that Ramberg and fellow campers have been using for camp meat. A fine of \$100 was levied against the visiting hunter, by Judge D. E. Van Vactor.

Two other arrests were made for failure to tag deer, as complaints were issued to James Leonard Peterson, 25, of Salem and W. G. Beard Jr., 32, of Medford. Peterson was apprehended at Big Valley in Lake County, and paid \$29.50 following his appearance before Justice of the Peace Tom Ferrell at Lakeview. Beard's case was not complete as of this writing, but was being taken care of by a Medford court. He was arrested at Rattlesnake Springs in Jackson County.

OUTDOOR BRIEFS from around the Basin... fishing season for lakes and most streams closes Sunday October 10 so many fishing enthusiasts will be taking a last crack at the sport this weekend... speaking of fishing, Klamath River produced some dandy catches to anglers who tried their luck on opening day last Friday... some very big trout were taken from the Southern Oregon stream by local fishermen as well as limit catches... dove hunting (if anyone has been still seeking the little birds) officially comes to an end the 10th also... of October that is... quail season opens October 30 at noon, while pheasant shooters will also open fire at the same time.

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## Prep Poll Leader Meets Eugene In Feature Game

All the top 10 teams in the Associated Press Oregon high school football poll are scheduled for action Friday night with South Salem, ranked No. 1, meeting strong Eugene in a featured game.

Eugene, with three victories and only one defeat, is expected to provide a real test for South Salem, which has a perfect record in four games. It will be a non-district contest.

Marshallfield, ranked No. 2, plays Roseburg in a district 5 game while third-ranked Medford, the class 1-A district 6 favorite, is best to Springfield in a non-district affair.

Prineville, No. 4, will be after its 22nd consecutive victory in three seasons when it meets Burns in a class 2-A district 8 contest.

Grants Pass, No. 5, goes out of the state to meet a formidable Longview team.

Milwaukie, No. 6, and Gresham, tied with Corvallis for eighth, are

heavy favorites in district 3 4 records. Forest Grove meets Gresham, Astoria and Milwaukie meets Parkrose.

Grant, ranked seventh, clashes with Cleveland in an important Portland league contest.

Corvallis travels to Bend for a district 8 game. Pendleton, No. 10, risks a perfect three-game record in a district 7 contest with Baker.

Forest Grove and Hillsboro will seek to preserve perfect district
