Jap Divers Plan To Quit Rescue Try

HAOKODATE, Japan Oct. 8 (AP) - Kyodo news service reported today that Japanese divers who have sought to recover bodies from the sunken ferry boat Toya Maru would discontinue operations tomorrow if no additional recoveries are made.

Kyodo said 113 passengers, including 12 Americans, still are missing, along with 18 members of the crew. The ferry went down in a typhoon Sept. 26. The Army has identified 42 U.S. military personnel who perished.

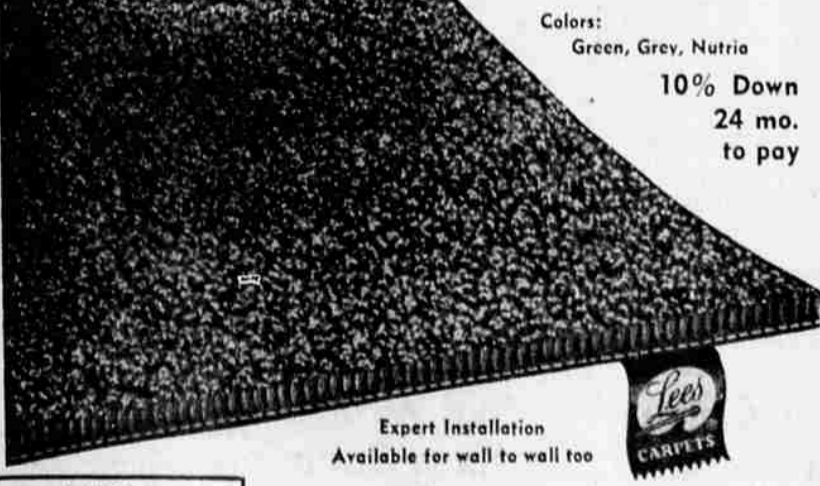
