## Hollywood Roundup Shows Busy Time In Film Capital

By BOB THOMAS HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Notes and comment on the Hollywood scene: Another busy news week in the film town. What can happen next? Maybe the Debbie Reynolds-Eddie Fisher engagement?

On Monday I sat and watched "I Love Lucy" along with Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz. Also a number of others who were invited to the home of Parke Levy, creator of the new Desilu show, "December Bride."

Lucille and Desi had just returned from New York, where they had been toasted on Ed Sullivan's show the night before.

The Arnazes chorlined in the darkened room as they watched their show. They seem to enjoy it as much as anyone. The finish showed Desi winning \$1,000 in the stock market.

"Is that all there is, Desi?" asked Lucille, who had forgotten the show, shot months ago.

"Sure honey," he replied. "Do you want me to make a fortune and ruin the show?"

Betty Grable, making her TV debut on the "Shower of Stars," got lost in the shuffle when all the fuss arose over Mario Lanza's mouthing to old records. She was never more nervous about a show; she told me as soon as it was over she ran to her dressing room.

I hope the Lanza fiasco will prompt the networks to shy away from pre-recording and other phony devices. Mouthing to records is okay in movies, where perfection can be achieved by retakes. But no TV singer can completely carry off the illusion of singing when he isn't.

TV's greatest asset is still its spontaneity. Nothing should be allowed to detract from it.

Press Meeting Site Selected RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) — The Inter-American Press Assn. has picked New Orleans for its 1955 meeting. The IAPA Board of Directors announced the choice yesterday. Spokane, Wash., also had been considered as a possible site.

The board elected Paulo Bittencourt, publisher of the Rio de Janeiro newspaper Correio da Manha as president, succeeding Mexico City publisher Miguel Lanza Durel.

Publisher James G. Stahman of the Nashville (Tenn.) Banner was elected first vice president. Other U.S. newsmen named to posts were Robert U. Brown of Editor and Publisher, New York, as treasurer, and Publisher John R. Reitemeyer of the Hartford (Conn.) Courant as chairman of the Executive Committee.

## British Plan To Question Reds

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — Britain's top delegate to the U.N. General Assembly prepared a list of searching questions today to test the sincerity of new Russian disarmament proposals which appear to meet some Western demands.

The British delegation chief, Minister of State Selwyn Lloyd, led off the speaking list as the Assembly's 60-nation main Political Committee launched its disarmament debate.

The debate, expected to continue for about two weeks, lists a British-French compromise plan accepted in principle last June by the United States with a similar proposal offered the U.N. 10 days ago by Russia's Andrei Y. Vishinsky.

## Spanish Leader Meets Americans

VALENCIA, Spain (AP) — Joint American-Spanish naval maneuvers appeared in the offing today after an official visit by Generalissimo Francisco Franco to the U.S. Mediterranean Fleet.

The chief of state and several other top Spanish officials spent yesterday aboard the aircraft carrier Coral Sea observing fleet battle exercises and firing practice.

Vice Adm. Thomas S. Combs, fleet commander, told a news conference the Americans wanted to hold joint maneuvers with Spain. High Spanish officials said their country would be pleased to take part.

## Jury Acquits Lawyer In Murder Case

WACO, Tex. (AP) — A south Texas lawyer has been acquitted of a charge he took part in a murder plot that wound up with a politician's son shot dead by mistake.

Nago Alaniz, 39, had been accused as part of what the state called a plot to kill Jacob S. Floyd Sr. of Alice, chief rival of Duval County political boss George B. Parr. The gunman got Floyd's son instead, the state said.

A jury yesterday found Alaniz, Duval County, innocent on a charge of accomplice to murder after a week-long trial here on a venue change.

Jacob S. Floyd Jr., 21, University of Texas student, was shot by a hidden gunman at the rear of the Floyd home the night of Sept. 8, 1952. At that moment, his father and Alaniz were meeting at an Alice drive-in.

Floyd Sr. said the meeting followed an urgent phone call by Alaniz in which the latter told Floyd to come by taxi, not his car.

The state claimed the triggerman was Alfredo Cervantes, a Mexican national who has never been arrested or indicted.

The state charged that Alaniz and Mario (El Turco) Sapat, San Antonio bar owner and former Duval County deputy sheriff, had plotted to have the elder Floyd killed. It said Alaniz was to lure Floyd Sr. to his garage with a telephone call but "lost his guts" at the last minute and called him to the secret meeting to warn him.

Sapat, the state said, was to provide the killer's getaway car. Sapat has been sentenced to 99 years on conspiracy charges in the slaying.

The jury, in effect, upheld the defense claim that Alaniz warned of the murder plot and heard Floyd Sr. of it because of past favors from Floyd. Alaniz did not testify, but his wife did. She said that on the night of Sept. 8 she received a telephone call from a Spanish-speaking person who did not identify himself. She said the caller told her to give "the lawyer" this message: "I am the man that talked to him Saturday and this matter is true and it will be tonight."

Mrs. Alaniz testified that when she gave her husband the message he rushed out of the house, saying it "might mean saving a man's life."

Woven through testimony was the struggle between Parr's political faction and the opposition Freedom party in Texas' four-county 79th Judicial District. The elder Floyd is a Freedom party leader.

He testified Alaniz told him professional killers were imported from Mexico to murder him because of politics.

After young Floyd was killed, Parr issued a public statement that he knew nothing about the slaying.

## French To Vote On New Arms Plan

PARIS (AP) — Premier Pierre Mendes-France pushed ahead today with his drive for quick National Assembly endorsement of the London agreement to rearm Germany.

He claimed an "important majority" would back him tomorrow in the parliamentary vote, which would unseat his government if he lost.

The National Council of the powerful Socialist party, which holds 105 seats in the 527-member Assembly, scheduled a meeting today to set the faction's policy on the nine-power proposals.

The National Committee of another major assembly group, the Popular Republican Movement (MRP), disapproved the London accord yesterday but left their deputies' Committee a final decision on how the 88 Assembly members from the party should vote.

The MRP, whose leaders include former Foreign Ministers Robert Schuman and Georges Bidault, had led the unsuccessful fight for Assembly approval of the European Defense Community (EDC).

The party contends that the London proposals do not contain enough of the international control of German rearmament which EDC would have provided.

The Socialist council who had backed EDC and expelled three top leaders from the party who voted against that treaty. A 50-50 split in the party's deputies on the EDC vote was one of the factors in its rejection in August.

Mendes-France apparently anticipates a sizable backing from the Socialists and MRP, no matter what their party commands decide. The Premier is certain of solid opposition from the Assembly's 100 Communists and fellow travelers.

Mendes-France voiced his confident expectations yesterday in a speech at Pont Saint-Pierre, in his native Normandy. He told his audience "a large area of agreement has appeared" in the Assembly debate on the London agreements.

"It is particularly refreshing to note not only that the debate took place in an atmosphere of conciliation and dignity," he said, "but also—and above all—that an important majority has now appeared which is ready to agree on an issue which has so deeply divided French opinion."

## O'Dwyer Plans To Testify

EL CENTRO, Calif. (AP) — William O'Dwyer, former mayor of New York who served a term as U. S. Ambassador to Mexico, has returned to this country to testify before a congressional committee.

O'Dwyer has accepted an invitation to appear in Los Angeles before a House subcommittee investigating Communist infiltration in Latin America, scheduled to meet Thursday and Friday.

The former New Yorker arrived at Tijuana, near San Diego, by plane from Mexico City yesterday and then came by automobile to the ranch here of his brother, Frank O'Dwyer.

At the Tijuana airport, O'Dwyer said he is practicing law in Mexico City and plans to live there the rest of his life. He declined comment on political matters, saying: "I've hung up my shoes," indicating he has given up politics.

He said he did not know if New York authorities planned to ask him to testify on any matters there. He added: "And I don't know if they asked me if I'd go. It depends on how much time I have."
